How we use your personal data

We may collect the following personal data from you:

• Name and contact details (email and telephone number)

We use this to complete golf tee time reservations and to contact you to manage the booking when required. The club also uses booking records to provide internal club usage statistics.

Who has access to your data

Access to your personal data is limited to Fulwell office and Pro Shop staff, and BRSGolf staff (for the purposes of technical support) if they are instructed by us. We will not share your details with third parties for marketing purposes.

Data retention

We retain booking records to enable us to carry forward any previous event information. We may also use booking records for internal statistical purposes. If you would like us to remove any personally identifiable elements from your booking please email <u>teetimes@fulwellgolfclub.co.uk</u>. Notwithstanding this, in certain cases, we may need to retain your data to satisfy legal, accounting, or reporting requirements.

Your rights
