Course Report

If it's not fallen leaves that have to be picked up, then it's very high winds resulting in the ground being covered in broken branches and hundreds of twigs! So how are our greens staff coping, during this wettest and windiest of winters. Here is Course Manager, Mike Laheen's report:

Today marks the last day of our 2-month hire of a wood chipper. We've managed to get a lot done in those two months considering we hadn't dared take it very far across the golf course throughout most of December!

Key target areas this winter were:

- 1. The 6th and 9th holes, clearing the view down the holes and making it possible to mow further into the treelines which should speed up play with less balls being lost to the right of either hole
- 2. The scrubby (and scruffy!) copse between 5 & 11. This went even better than I'd hoped as we've been able to get in with the 'new' Toro 360 and take out all the bramble and self-set hawthorn, blackthorn and ash trees. An area has been left as habitat for any displaced birds and small mammals.
- 3. Clearing out a lot of standing dead or diseased trees (more than 30!)

In addition to this, we've managed to clear out another overgrown area between 15 & 16; continue on the quest to raise lower limbs around the course; remove a few more 'problem trees' as identified in the Tree Management plan agreed in 2022 and even more beyond that.

I've had a few enquiries about the availability of logs for firewood recently (can't think why!) but the vast majority have already gone as part of an agreement with our regular tree surgeon. Some do remain and we will make them available in the main car park for members to take home and season for their own use.

All told, the course has held up well through the winter so far. There will certainly be some work to do on the greens as we move into spring. Some mossy areas have established, particularly where disease and drought stress from the summer reduced grass coverage going into the wet months.

Please be assured that this will be dealt with as part of our spring maintenance programme. It is also worth noting that this moss ingress is not from the Silvery Thread Moss that was widespread a few years ago!

Here's looking forward to some drier, sunnier days. I'm done with Winter now!

We are too Mike! Special thanks to you and your team for all the work during the winter, which is appreciated by members and visitors alike.

Chair of Greens Roger Corp has set up the Voluntary Corps (excuse the pun) to assist Mike and his team. Some members of the group met up with Mike where they learnt about bunker maintenance, clearance of tree debris, weeding and the retrieval of buried balls on the range, when over 1000 balls were recovered! At 50p a ball, that is one big saving! Many thanks to those who took part. If you wish to join the VC, please inform the office or
