
LADY CAPTAIN'S REPORT

SENIORS SECTION

Philip Sell, Seniors Captain 2025

The playing season is winding down but there is plenty more on offer.

Our 22 interclub matches have completed for 2025. We had 9 wins. 11 losses and 2 halved matches. A very similar outcome to 2024. In June we introduced the requirement of 3 cards in the last six months to be eligible for these matches, in all probability that number will be revised upwards next year as the season progresses. 42 individuals have participated. There were 365 sign-ups for matches, with an overall selection rate of 75% through the random draw process. Next year the match managers for the Interclub seniors will be Phil Sell and Tim Green.

Our very able squad that reached the Leicestershire and Rutland Golf Union Seniors Knockout semi-final came second in that match.

There is one remaining qualifying match for the Lewis trophy, that is a medal competition for the 'Silver Lady' trophy. The Silver Lady Trophy will be replaced with a new Individual and Team medal Trophy in 2026.

The Seniors Autumn Open still has a few places available on the 2nd October.

The Seniors section AGM will occur in the clubhouse McKensie room at 1700 on Monday 20th October. It should last no more than one hour. All are welcome.

A new development is a medal competition on the 24th of November. The teams of three will be randomly drawn. A new trophy in the form of two Edwardian coffee and milk jugs will be awarded, one to the best individual medal player and one to the best combined team score, this is in the interests of encouraging integration and mixing within senior's events. It will be followed in the evening with a dinner when the Seniors Trophy awards will occur.

The Seniors Winter Six starts 27th October, sign up on ClubV1before the 23rd of October, as that is when the random draw for teams will occur. The closing date for the seniors' winter league is the 31st October and your team will have to have paid the entry by then.

The Seniors section is an active integral part of our club and is a very inclusive group that provides competitive golf and social golf within a supportive structure. We offer more than just 18 holes for those that have Ikigai.




Dear Mr Rickett and Ms Marston,
