1 INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Brickhampton Court Golf Club (BCGC) Competitions Handbook. The purpose of this handbook is to set out the terms, conditions and details of the competitions held at BCGC throughout the year.

Competitions are administered by the Handicap and Competitions Committee, who are responsible for ensuring members are kept fully informed about upcoming events, their entry requirements and for timely publication of results.

As a fully inclusive club, most of the competitions held at BCGC are open to all Spa members who hold a World Handicap System (WHS) Handicap Index (HI). If you do not currently hold a HI please refer to the Getting Started document which details how to submit verified cards to gain your first handicap.

The exceptions are:

- Seniors' competitions with the criteria of being 55 years of age or older.
- Juniors' competitions with the criteria of being under the age of 18 as of 1 January.
- Men only competitions: Men's Club Championships, St Andrew's Plate, Mens' Rabbits, Ward Bowl (which are detailed in the Terms of Competition).
- Ladies only competitions: Ladies Club Championships (Silver and Bronze), Ladies' Rabbits, Eclectics,
 Ladies Memorial Bowl (which are detailed in the Terms of Competition).

Some competitions are restricted to players within a HI range and/or type of membership and these are specified within the Terms of Competition.

2 GENERAL TERMS OF COMPETITION AND REGULATIONS

These General Terms of Competition and Regulations are applicable to all Brickhampton Court (BCGC) competitions and supersedes all other documentation.

2.1 RULES OF GOLF

- 2.1.1 All BCGC competitions will be played in accordance with:
 - the Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal & Ancient Golf Club of St Andrew's.
 - BCGC Local Rules.
 - BCGC Pace of Play Policy.
 - BCGC Motorised Transportation Policy.
 - BCGC Code of Conduct.
 - BCGC Spectator Code.
- 2.1.2 The Terms of Competition for BCGC competitions (set out in sections 4,5,6 and 7 of this document), as approved by the Handicap and Competitions Committee and the General Committee, take precedence over these General Terms of Competitions and Regulations.

2.2 BEHAVIOUR

2.2.1 All players, officials and supporters are expected to comply with the BCGC Code of Conduct and are requested to familiarise themselves with this policy in advance of competing in competitions.

2.3 GENERAL COMPETITION DETAILS

- 2.3.1 The dates of all competitions are shown in the Fixture List, which is available early in each year in hard copy, on the web site in the Members Lounge under Events, on Howdidido and via the ClubV1 Hub.
- 2.3.2 The Fixture List details the BCGC Honour Board Competitions (i.e., Majors).
- 2.3.3 The Fixture List indicates those competitions that are:
 - Qualifiers (Q) i.e., these will appear on a participating members England Golf record for handicapping purposes.
 - Drawn (D) i.e., the Handicap and Competitions Committee will determine the groupings and teetimes for participants.
- 2.3.4 Competitions are mixed gender and played over a single round (other than knock-outs that are played over multiple rounds subject to the number of entries and as determined by the Handicap and Competitions Secretary and the Club Championships).
- 2.3.5 Competitions will use the Handicap Allowance, as specified by England Golf, that is relevant to the format of the competition.
- 2.3.6 It is expected that all knock-out competitions will be arranged and played in a mature and sporting manner, with consideration being given to opponent's circumstances.
- 2.3.7 Players are expected to wear recognised golf apparel.

2.4 ENTRIES

- 2.4.1 Competition Information Sheets (posters) are displayed on the appropriate Competition Notice Boards approximately 6 weeks prior to the date of the competition, and they include:
 - The format of the competition.
 - Confirmation of the qualifying status of the competition (for handicap and Majors).
 - Entry requirements.
 - How to enter the competition.
 - The Entry Fee to be paid and when the fee will be taken.

- Where relevant, when the competition will close to entries.
- Where appropriate, the actions to be completed after the round.
- 2.4.2 Competitions are open to seven-day, five-day, Flexi and Twilight members with a current Handicap Index. Five-day and Twilight members may play in weekend competitions subject to the payment of the appropriate Green Fee in addition to the competition Entry Fee. Junior members must hold an official WHS Handicap Index to be eligible to enter adult Club competitions and the Junior member's card must be marked by an adult member.
- 2.4.3 Members can enter competitions via the PSI, ClubV1 Hub and HowDidiDo.
- 2.4.4 To participate in competitions members will be required to either Advance Book or to Sign In on the day of the competition.
 - Entries for Majors with Advance Booking will close 2 weeks before the date of the competition.
 - Most other competitions that require members to Advance Book will close 8 days before the date of the competition.
- 2.4.5 All players who enter a competition accept that they will be required to play in the same team or group as any other player that has entered.
- 2.4.6 If a member enters a competition for which they are ineligible because they are serving a competition ban imposed by the Handicap and Competitions Secretary, they will be removed from the competition and the specified Entry Fee will be refunded to their Competition Account.
- 2.4.7 If a member enters a competition but fails to meet the entry requirements the specified Entry Fee will be refunded to their Competition Account. However, if the member has failed to meet the number of Qualifiers required, the Handicap and Competitions Secretary may at their discretion allow the member to participate in the competition (paying the specified Entry Fee) but they will not be eligible to win the competition or to receive any prize monies.
- 2.4.8 The entry procedures for competitions will be in accordance with the BCGC Competitions Entry and Withdrawal Procedures, a copy of which can be found in the Members Lounge under Club Policies & Procedures and in the Members Information File.
- 2.4.9 All members have a responsibility to ensure their Handicap Index is representative of their playing ability. The Handicap and Competitions Committee monitor penalty scores and deleted score intents and, where appropriate, will remind a member of their responsibility. If a member continues to incur penalty scores and/or deletes score intents, the Handicap and Competitions Committee reserves the right to refuse the member entry to competitions or deem them ineligible for prizes until the member achieves a representative Handicap Index.
- 2.4.10 All competition entries are subject to the approval of the Handicap and Competitions Committee, which reserves the right to accept, refuse or cancel an entry should it fail to meet the requirements of the competition or fulfil the correct entry procedure. The Handicap and Competitions Committee decision shall be final. Where appropriate any Entry Fee will be refunded.

2.5 ENTRY FEES

- 2.5.1 The standard Entry Fee for competitions is £3.00, which is allocated as follows:
 - For Club Majors and Monthly Medal competitions the entry fees will be split evenly between the Trophy fund, Prize fund and Club fund.
 - For all other competitions (excluding Club Night) the entry fees will be split evenly between the Prize fund and Club fund.
 - For Club Night £2.50 will go into the Prize fund and £0.50 will go into the Club fund.
- 2.5.2 Details of those competitions which have a different entry fee are clearly displayed both on the Competition Information Sheets and in the Terms of Competition below.
- 2.5.3 The BCGC Competitions Account Procedures, a copy of which can be found in the Members Lounge under Club Policies & Procedures and in the Members Information File requires members to keep their competition accounts in credit, from which entry fees will be deducted. A member who fails to

enter a competition in the specified manner may be deemed to have neither a score for the competition nor a score for handicap purposes.

2.6 ELIGIBILITY FOR HONOUR BOARD COMPETITIONS (MAJORS)

- 2.6.1 To participate in a Major, a member must have three scoring 18-hole rounds in qualifying individual stroke play competitions on their golf record during the twelve-month period prior to the date that entries close for the competition.
- 2.6.2 The qualifying rounds on a player's golf record may be from:
 - BCGC Competitions (i.e., those denoted with 'Q' in the Fixture List and are indicated as such on the Competition Information Sheets).
 - Away qualifying competitions, (such as County events or individual Opens), organised by an affiliated Club or Union.
 - To enter the Senior Championships, qualifying rounds must be in Senior competitions.
- 2.6.3 If a new member can provide a current playing record that includes three qualifying competitions at an Affiliated Golf Club, the Handicap and Competitions Committee may, once satisfied with the details provided, allow the member to participate in Honour Board Competitions using the existing qualifying rounds on their record.
- 2.6.4 Any member failing to meet the above may, at the discretion of the Handicap and Competitions Committee, participate in an Honours Board Competition and count it as a qualifier on their golf record for Club Majors, but they will not be eligible to win any prizes in that competition.
- 2.6.5 Flexi and Twilight members are not eligible to enter Majors.

2.7 RESERVES

- 2.7.1 If a member misses the closing date of a competition, they should contact the Handicap and Competitions Secretary to request they be added to the reserve list. Should any places become available in the competition, reserves will be invited to play in the order the Handicap and Competitions Secretary added them to the reserve list. If a member accepts the invite, any Entry Fee will then be taken from their Competition Account.
- 2.7.2 To ensure full fields for competitions and at the sole discretion of the Handicap and Competitions Secretary, reserve or reserves may be offered a place depending on whether they can be contacted irrespective of their place on the reserve list.
- 2.7.3 In the event of a late withdrawal of a player from a BCGC competition, a member on the reserve list who is present at the club may be offered the vacant start place. If there are several members present who are on the reserve list, they will be invited to play by the Handicap and Competitions Secretary in the order they are listed on the reserve list.

2.8 DRAWN COMPETITIONS

- 2.8.1 On the closing date for entries the Handicap and Competitions Committee will check that any relevant qualifying criteria has been met by entrants and conduct a draw.
- 2.8.2 Family members are not permitted to be drawn to play together as a team or to play in the same group.
- 2.8.3 Start times will be posted on the appropriate noticeboard or ClubV1 Members Hub approximately one week prior to the date of the competition.
- 2.8.4 Changes to start times can only be made by the Handicap and Competitions Committee.

2.9 WITHDRAWALS AND PENALTIES

- 2.9.1 Members should refer to the BCGC Competition Entry and Withdrawal Procedures.
- 2.9.2 Before the closing date of a competition, members may withdraw by removing their name from the booking and they will receive a full refund of the Entry Fee.

- 2.9.3 A member who withdraws after the closing date or leaves the course part way through a competition will not typically be refunded any Entry Fee.
- 2.9.4 In Majors, withdrawing after the closing date without notice will lead to a two-competition ban.
- 2.9.5 In a drawn pairs' competition, if one of the pair is unable to play it is the responsibility of the partner to arrive at the allocated tee-time to mark the other pairs score card. Failure to do so will result in a two-competition ban for both players.
- 2.9.6 The Handicap and Competitions Secretary reserves the right to provide refunds, impose or reduce bans/penalties if there are extenuating circumstances.

2.10 COMPETITION ARRIVAL

- 2.10.1 Members are expected to be on their starting tee (normally the 1st tee unless advised otherwise in the competition Start Sheet) and ready to commence their round 10 minutes before their start time.
- 2.10.2 For competitions with a Starter, members are expected to pay attention when the competition rules are read to them and to adhere to these during the round.
- 2.10.3 Members should refer to the BCGC Starter Procedure for details of what is expected of them when they are assigned as a Starter on the Start Sheet.
- 2.10.4 Members are required to Sign In on the PSI before commencing a round as per the instructions on a Competition Information Sheet or instructed by a Starter.

2.11 CADDIES

- 2.11.1 Caddies are permitted with the following conditions:
 - Junior members may only have a Junior as their caddie.
 - No caddies are allowed in the Junior Championships.

2.12 SPECTATORS

2.12.1 Spectators are welcome to follow groups on the course, but they must adhere to the BCGC Spectator Code.

2.13 REFEREES

- 2.13.1 The Handicap and Competitions Secretary reserves the right to allocate individuals to accompany groups around the course in the capacity of a Referee.
- 2.13.2 Where a Referee is appointed, players may seek to clarify rules with them.
- 2.13.3 If there is not a referee available and there is a Rules question, the player and their marker must speak to a member of the Committee as soon as possible after completing the round.

2.14 INCLEMENT WEATHER, CANCELLATION AND FORCE MAJEUR

- 2.14.1 The Handicap and Competitions Committee reserves the right to cancel or postpone indefinitely, a competition at any time if required to do so or if in its opinion it is reasonable in the circumstances to do so, due to events beyond its reasonable control.
 - If a competition is cancelled all Entry Fees will be refunded to members Competition Accounts.
 - If a competition is postponed the existing entries will be transferred to a new date, a new closing date will be put in place and participating members will be notified.

2.15 POST ROUND AND RETURNING THE SCORE CARD

- 2.15.1 Players should enter their score on the PSI.
- 2.15.2 A players score card is deemed officially returned to the Handicap and Competitions Committee when it is posted into the Lectern.

- 2.15.3 No cards will be accepted after the day of the competition unless otherwise agreed with the Handicap and Competition Secretary. If the Clubhouse is closed, members should put the completed score card in the post box situated outside the entrance to the Clubhouse.
- 2.15.4 All score cards must be returned whether the round has been completed or not.
- 2.15.5 Failure to return a correctly completed score card will result in disqualification from the competition. Any subsequence breach will be subject to a further two-competition ban.
- 2.15.6 In the event of a discrepancy between the score card and ClubV1/WHS Platform, the Handicap and Competitions Committee will treat a score card as the master record for the round and will correct the scores on the system to match it.

2.16 WINNERS, DECISIONS OF TIES AND PRIZE MONEY

- 2.16.1 The following will determine winners:
 - In Medal competitions, it will be the lowest nett score.
 - In Stableford competitions, it will be the highest number of points.
 - In Par/Bogey competitions, it will be the highest number of points.
 - In Match Play competitions, it will be the greatest number of holes.
- 2.16.2 On closure of a competition, the Handicap and Competitions Committee will review the number of entrants:
 - If there are less than five entrants in a competition, then the competition will be cancelled.
 members who have entered will be refunded. If it is a qualifying single stroke play competition,
 their scores will still count for handicapping purposes and count as a qualifying competition for
 entry to club Majors.
 - If there are between six and twenty six entrants to a competition, the result will be determined on an overall basis (i.e., there will be no divisions).
 - If there are twenty seven or more entrants to a competition, the result will be split into divisions as determined by the Handicap and Competitions Committee.
 - If there are at least (five) ladies' entrants in a monthly medal competition, a separate Ladies Division will be created by the Handicap and Competitions Committee.
- 2.16.3 The Handicap and Competitions Committee will decide ties on the last 9, 6, 3 and 1 holes of the completed round. If a tie still arises it will be decided on the last 9, 6, 3 and 1 holes first 9 holes.
- 2.16.4 Using the available Prize fund for a competition, the Handicap and Competitions Committee will determine the positions to receive prizes and the monetary value, and this will the paid into the winner's competition account.
- 2.16.5 The results of competitions, together with details of the prize money paid, will be available for members in the Competitions Folder in the Lectern.

2.17 KNOCK-OUTS

- 2.17.1 No player should enter a knock-out competition if:
 - They cannot provide reasonable availability to meet the close dates for each competition round.
 - They are unable to play on the finals day (which is specified in the Fixture List).
 - There is a risk that, later, they might have to withdraw.
- 2.17.2 In all knock-out competitions both the first named player(s) and their opponent(s) are equally responsible for arranging the date and time of their match.
- 2.17.3 If a player is unable to contact their opponent(s), or in case of dispute, they should contact the Handicap and Competition Secretary as soon as possible and no later than seven days before the closing date of the round. If the players are unable to agree, all will be disqualified and the opponent(s) that would have played the winners in the next round will be granted a bye to the subsequent round.
- 2.17.4 There will be no extensions to the closing date of any round of a knock-out competition, except:

- If the course has been closed for any reason for a period of time, the closing date for that round and any subsequent round(s) may be extended by the Handicap and Competitions Committee.
- If a player who reaches the final of the knock-out competition suffers an injury and is unable to play at the time arranged, the Handicap and Competitions Committee may, with the agreement of the opponent(s), postpone the match for a reasonable period.
- 2.17.5 For knock-out competitions, if a player's circumstances change and they become unable to play in the published finals day once the competition has started, they must withdraw immediately and not play any further rounds. For the Club knock-out they must promptly notify the Handicap and Competition Secretary (Seniors action is set out in the BCGC Seniors Competition Procedure). In this event, the opponent(s) that they would have played at the point of withdrawal will be declared the winners and progress to the next round. At the time a player becomes unable to play on the finals day and fails to withdraw immediately, they will be banned from entering any of the knock-out competitions the following year.
- 2.17.6 The Handicap and Competitions Secretary reserves the right to provide refunds, impose or reduce bans/penalties if there are extenuating circumstances.

2.18 PHOTOGRAPHY CONSENT

2.18.1 On social large competition days, it is likely that photographs will be taken. If members do not wish their photo to be taken or shared on social media, they must make their wishes known to the organiser of the day i.e., on Captains' Days.

2.19 LIABILITY

2.19.1 BCGC cannot be held responsible for the loss of or damage to, equipment or personal possessions.

 - Club Night runs on Wednesday nights and is scheduled from 3 April 2024 to 11 September 2024 (23 games with Presentation Night being a standalone competition). It is open to all members of Brickhampton Court Golf Club.
 - Play takes place, on a roll up basis, over the front 9 holes of the Spa course; the first tee is at 3.30pm and the last tee is at 6.30pm. No tee time reservations are necessary.
 - To assist in maintaining a cashless society, members must enter via the PSI, HowDidiDo or the Club V1 Members Hub before they go out to play, when a fee of £3 will be deducted.
 - Score cards must be returned to the organisers by 8.30pm.

5.2 FORMAT

- 5.2.1 Club Night is played as follows:
 - A Stableford competition over the first 9 holes of the Spa Course.
 - A 'Ready Golf' approach to ensure a good pace of play.
 - Men play off the Grey tees and Ladies play off the Green tees.
 - Initial Club Night handicaps are the unrounded handicap as detailed in the handicap tables available to view on the competitions noticeboard.
 - There is no handicap allowance; players play off 100% of their Club Night handicap.
 - There is no course rating adjustment for this competition; there are no additional shots for Men or Ladies.
 - Split into Divisions as follows:
 - Men's Division 1 Club Night Handicap 0 to 14.
 - Men's Division 2 Club Night Handicap 15 to 40.
 - Ladies Club Night Handicap 0 to 54.
 - Winners' and runners-up Club Night handicaps are adjusted each evening.
 - Best 13 scores count towards the players' overall score for the season.

5.3 PLAYING HANDICAPS

- 5.3.1 To participate in Club Night, members are required to have a current WHS Handicap Index by entering competitions and/or submitting General Play scores.
- 5.3.2 For **one season only** members without a WHS Handicap Index can participate in Club Night and will have their Club Night handicap calculated after 3 Club Night cards have been submitted; there is no fee for these 3 rounds and members will be eligible only to win sponsor balls. For these players there will be no reductions in handicaps for the first three competitions and these scores <u>will not</u> be included in the main competition results.
- 5.3.3 Once members' Club Night handicaps have been determined they will be moved to the appropriate Division, pay the entry fee and be eligible for all prizes.
- 5.3.4 If a player with a Club Night handicap subsequently obtains a current **WHS Handicap Index** during the Club Night season, he/she will play off the lower of the two handicaps. Previous scores will not be amended.
- 5.3.5 All players with a current **WHS Handicap Index** start each year on their course handicap as at the date of their first Club Night round their Club Night handicap from the previous year is discarded.

- 5.3.6 The Club Night handicap is specific to Club Night it may not be used in other Club competitions and is not connected in any way to a *WHS Handicap Index*.
- 5.3.7 Members are required to obtain a current **WHS Handicap Index** if they wish to take part in the next or subsequent year's Club Night.

5.4 HANDICAP CUTS

- 5.4.1 Men and Ladies in all division:
 - Winner Club Night Handicap cut by 3 shots
 Second Club Night Handicap cut by 2 shots
 Third Club Night Handicap cut by 1 shot
- 5.4.2 Plus an additional Club Night Handicap cut for any points over 20
 - 21 points Club Night Handicap cut by an extra 1 shot
 22 points Club Night Handicap cut by an extra 2 shots
 23 points Club Night Handicap cut by an extra 3 shots
- 5.4.3 Members' Club Night Handicaps will continue to be cut even when they reach '0'

5.5 PRIZES

- 5.5.1 On each night that the competition is played prizes are awarded for winners and runners-up in each of the divisions. There are also prizes for various Longest Drives and Nearest the Pins.
- 5.5.2 The Nearest the Pin and Longest Drive prizes are dependent on the number of Sponsors each year (Sponsors are approached by the Club Night Organisers). All competitors are eligible for these prizes.
- 5.5.3 A Presentation Evening is held at the end of each Club Night season. All prizes are vouchers which are redeemable against any purchase in the shop, range, simulator or, by 5-day members, against weekend green fees.

6 OTHER BRICKHAMPTON COURT COMPETITIONS

Each Captain and the President, hold fun golfing days over the course of the summer season. These are for teams of three.
