Ladies Section Rules and Information

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Rules of Membership of Ladies Section

Membership

All Ladies are full and equal members of Puttenham Golf Club and are bound by the Rules thereof. Membership shall be in any one of five categories:

- a) 7-day
- b) Village Club
- c) Junior
- d) Social
- e) Flexible Points

However, provision is made for an additional category of Life Membership, which shall be granted to a member who has made an outstanding contribution to the Club. Such Life Membership shall follow approval of a proposed and seconded resolution to an Annual General Meeting of the club.

Section

Ladies shall have playing rights on the Course in accordance with their category of membership and in accordance with the rules of Puttenham Golf Club. These latter rules provide for the Ladies' Section to have exclusive rights to the first tee on Tuesday mornings between 08:00 and 10:30. There is a Ladies main day and alternate day as designated in the competition rules within this document. The competition rules shall be set out by the Ladies Committee and reviewed annually. Any lady entering any competition shall be bound by the rules of that competition. To the extent that Ladies' competitions continue to be held separately, both within the Club and for external matches, events and fixtures, such affairs shall be managed by a Committee representing the Ladies Section.

Committee

The Committee shall consist of Lady Members elected for a 3-year term at an Annual General Meeting, always providing that the Committee may co-opt additional members at any time. Such co-opted members shall be temporary full members of the Committee but shall submit themselves for election at the next AGM following their co-option. Lady members proposed for election onto the Committee must be members of Puttenham Golf Club in any category. There shall be no more than 10 members of the Committee, but their numbers shall include the Captain and Vice-Captain. Committee members shall carry out specific responsibilities, as delegated by the Captain and acknowledged by the Committee as a whole. The Committee includes 3 officers and they may serve for an additional time on the Committee as stated below:

Captain	One year
Vice-Captain	One year
Competition Secretary	Three years

Serving as an officer may extend the time on the Committee but no Committee member should serve more than 6 years without seeking re-election, or accepting the position of Vice-Captain and subsequently Captain.

All members shall carry one vote in respect of Committee decisions and if required the Ladies' Captain shall have the casting vote. A minimum of 5 Committee members shall be required to form a quorum. The Committee shall appoint a lady member to represent the Ladies' section at Surrey Ladies County Golf Association (SLCGA) meetings. If this representative is not a committee member, she should report back to the Committee on SLCGA matters.

Note: Due to COVID19 and the significant disruption to golf arrangements for 2020/2021, The Captain / Vice Captain were asked to take an extended term of two years to March 2022 to bring us back into the normal cycle

Captain

The Captain and Vice-Captain of the Ladies' Section shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. A working party consisting of present Captain, present Vice-Captain and three past Captains will confer, approve and if necessary, vote on the Captain Elect's (i.e., current Vice-Captain) choice of Vice-Captain.

Although it is generally understood that the Vice-Captain will go on to be Captain in the following year, election nevertheless has to be carried at the AGM. The members of the Ladies' Section shall be informed of this choice not less than two months prior to the AGM.

Meetings

The Committee shall meet at least 6 times a year, at such times and places notified by the Honorary Secretary and shall have the full power to carry out the affairs of the section.

Annual General Meeting (AGM)

An AGM shall be held within twelve months of the previous AGM. Suggestions for topics to be included in the agenda shall be proposed in writing by members of the Ladies' Section, not later than two weeks prior to the AGM.

Changes to the Rules of Membership of Ladies Section shall be made only when two thirds of the members present at an AGM vote for such a change. Changes to the General Competition Rules may be made by committee or taken to the AGM as deemed appropriate.

General Competition Rules / Committee Competition Responsibilities

The Ladies' Captain is responsible for the calendar of events. The Competitions Secretary and her deputy are responsible for the organisation of knockouts and various trophy events as specified in Appendix I. They maintain a list of all winners and runners up. Collecting cups and trophies for engraving before the Club Presentation evening is carried out by a designated person. They publish a list of competition winners for non-handicap events, other than those indicated by the Ladies' Captain (e.g., Captains Day, Captain vs. Vice-Captain). The determinations of some awards are the responsibility of other committee members or lady members as specified in Appendix I.

Responsibility for special competitions such as Autumn and Spring Meetings, and Invitations is delegated to committee members.

The Pro Shop is responsible for maintaining WHS Handicap Rules compliance. They ensure production of results from computer records for handicap qualifying events and others as listed. Additionally, they provide information to the Competition Secretary for determination of qualification for competitions or trophy awards and the designated committee member for birdies. A member of the committee is responsible for the Eclectic competition.

The Surrey Ladies County Golf Association club competitions such as the Wallis, Pearson, Derry, and Centenary Bowl have specific rules and responsibility for organisation is delegated by the Ladies' Captain.

Friendly Matches are scheduled by a nominated committee member in liaison with the Vice-Captain and Captain for compilation of the diary. Day to day organisation is delegated to the Friendly Match Organiser.

Please see the identified roles and responsibilities for this year's committee in the Appendices section

A designated committee member is responsible for organising the documentation for the club to enter the competitions listed.

Tuesday is Ladies Day (Main day) and Sunday is the Main Alternate Day and a New Ladies Table introduced during 2020 for a Friday afternoon roll up.

Ladies have been allocated tee slots from 8.30 - 10.30 every Tuesday. On Sundays the Ladies Table have an allocated tee allocation from 10.00 - 10.50. Should the Sunday competition be particularly popular, then a committee member needs to be ready to book an additional tee slot(s) either just before or just after our allocated time.

The Friday afternoon allocation has been granted by the club each week from 2.00pm (1.50 in the winter months). This allows an additional option for ladies to play 9 or 18 holes during the lighter evenings and reverting to 9 holes in the winter. This Ladies Table has been primarily set up to encourage ladies to come out to play 'no pressure golf' and is an opportunity for ladies to practice in a more social setting. Any competitions organised on the day will be fun and not recorded. However, in 2022, a new 9 Hole Stableford competition will be organised in memory of Betty Morris and we plan to include a 4BBB Qualifier in June to allow entry for the National Ping 4BBB. Both will take place on an identified date on the Friday Table.

Weekend competitions may also be played on Saturday. Although the distinction between alternate and main day players has been removed for competitions, it is retained in this document. This enables a distinction between players who mainly play weekends only and those who primarily play on weekdays.

Competition Playing Groups

There is a roll up system for most competitions with allocation of partners by the lady member on Tuesday 'Desk Duty'. For roll up purposes pre-arrangement to play together is discouraged, with the exception of the lady member on desk duty or new players to the club. Allocation of playing partners is generally on order of arrival, but some matching of handicaps occurs for Medals. On the weekend roll up competitions Medals are played in handicap order, for all others, cards are drawn to determine playing partners.

Note: In winter months the Ladies Section can determine if it is necessary to revert to pre-organised tee times to identify whether we have any spare slots that could be re-allocated on the booking system.

Where numbers allow on routine Tuesday roll ups Medal, Stableford and Par competitions will be in twos for those who arrive before 08:30 and in threes thereafter. Bowmakers and Texas Scrambles will be played in threes, and other types of play (e.g., Greensomes, Foursomes, Four Ball Better Ball) in fours. Special competitions will be as indicated on sign-up sheets. Weekend singles competitions may vary in number of players per group, but team competitions must be as for Tuesdays.

Medals

England Golf (EG – previously EWGA) stipulate a maximum of twenty-four and minimum of four Medal competitions per year. At Puttenham there is generally one Medal a month between March and November plus some additional ones incorporated into special competitions. Medals are not held in December, January and February. Medals rounds are held in compliance with EG rules.

Stableford and Par Competitions

These are held according to the fixture list. Weather permitting, we try to organise at least four Par competitions held from 1st October to 30th April to allow the award of the Dixon Salver.

Players may play singles competitions on both the Main and Weekend Day, paying the entry fee on each occasion. The best card will count for the competition but both cards will count for handicap if qualifying, this also applies for the annual Turkey Trot competitions in November. When a trophy and monthly competition are combined (e.g., Davis Trophy Medal) the first round will count towards the trophy, and the monthly competition.

Nine Hole qualifying Stableford competitions will be organised throughout the year.

Pairs and Team Events

Unless organised as separate competitions, players may only play on one of the days (i.e., Main or Weekend). There is no restriction or prior notice of play required, with the exceptions of competition sign up requirements for named competitions.

Special Trophies, Knock-Outs, Qualification Events

The rules regarding trophies and knockouts are listed in Competitions and Trophies. Additional competitions are run on a national basis and are governed by the awarding organisation (e.g., Daily Mail Foursomes).

Competition Entry

For roll-up competitions players must indicate their intention to play by registering on the PSI electronic terminal or via the HowDidIDo App on your phone. The competition fee will be deducted from the players Club Card on registration. Scores must be entered on the terminal/ phone by the end of the day of the competition.

Out of courtesy to the members, ladies should arrive by 9.45 on Tuesdays, or inform us that you are coming! At the Weekends, arrangements vary as there is no course closure for ladies. At present tee times are still allocated prior to the Sunday by an organiser via a WhatsApp group. This may revert back to the previous arrangement which was that Sunday play commences at 10:00, with ladies meeting in the Spike Bar to draw cards at 9.45. Ladies are entitled to play in any of the Men's Tables on a Saturday and should liaise with the Named Table Organiser. There is opportunity for Saturday play in the summer months (April to October) tee off will be usually 11:00 between the Men's Tables

On Tuesdays, players should identify themselves to the Committee member on Desk Duty in the changing room before you go out on the course. At the weekend the players need to let the Sunday organiser know in advance to arrange tee times and know if you are playing in the competition.

If the competition is not a roll-up, a sign-up sheet is displayed on the notice board at least four weeks in advance of play. This is usually for 'Fun Events' / Pairs and Team Events. There is no requirement to sign up for Birdie or Par Tree competitions and Eclectics.

Withdrawal from Competitions

When a sign- up sheet has been removed or an order of play drawn up, the participating players are committed to compete. Any player withdrawing, for any reason, may forfeit their entry fee or the match (in the case of Knockouts). It is the player's responsibility to inform the Competition Secretary or the person responsible for the competition as indicated on the sign-up procedure of her withdrawal. In a pairs competition the playing partner may be required to mark a card and will still be liable for their element of the entry fee.

If the competition involves pre-payment of competition fees there will only be a refund given for withdrawal if the player(s) inform the Competition Secretary at least 3 days in advance of Competition commencement. A shorter notice may be accepted:

- If a substitute player(s) is arranged by the withdrawing player (team).
- In the case of extreme unpredictable events beyond the players control (e.g., broken limbs, family bereavement or emergency).

If there is a portion of catering in the entry fee the Club has rules regarding refunds and due notice. If competitions involve catering and/ or purchased prizes as part of the competition fee the committee reserve the right to retain all the fees.

Cancellation or Abandonment of a Competition

The Committee has the right to declare void any competition. In such circumstances the committee may decide to reschedule or void the competition without rescheduling (refunds given) in the following circumstances:

- Course closure.
- In the case of extreme weather or playing conditions such as high winds, snow, rain which persist for sufficient duration to warrant course closure (e.g., with flooded greens, safety issues).
- Administrative problems relating to the running of the competition.
- Significant discrepancies between courses played on Main and Weekend days when such a competition provides qualification for an external event or a trophy.
- Fewer entrants than the minimum specified in Appendix I.

In the event of significant discrepancies between the courses played for a competition not for a trophy or qualification for an external event the competition will be treated as two separate days with prizes awarded for each (see Entrant Numbers and Prizes for Competitions on page 5 & 5).

If one day of a trophy competition played on both the Main and Weekend day is abandoned the results from the day that is played will stand and the other day will be rescheduled as soon as is practicable.

When playing for a trophy the course played on the main and alternate day needs to be comparable. When the course on main and alternate days differs in such a way that cannot be considered comparable (e.g. temporary greens and bucket holes), then the committee will decide on the fairest outcome for all participants. This may involve a replay of one or both days of the competition, and if this is not possible the competition may be abandoned with no trophy awarded.

The Wood Putter Cup is associated with Ladies' Captains Day and may be abandoned or postponed at the Captain's discretion.

DIVISIONS AND PRIZES FOR COMPETITIONS

Club competition winners are in divisions and prizes awarded on combined weekend and weekday play. If the course condition renders one of the singles competition days as non-qualifying and the other day is qualifying, then the days will be treated as separate competitions.

The allocation of players to divisions for the purpose of allocating prizes is based on the total numbers of players who have played over the two days, and the playing handicaps of those players. One division will be used it there is less than 30 players in total, and two divisions for 30 players and more. The number of players in each division will be made as equal as possible i.e. if 40 players are competing then there would be as close to 20 players as possible in each division dependent on handicap levels. This would be calculated by the Golf Shop Team after the competition has been completed.

Prizes in the Ladies Eclectic and the Ladies Birdie Tree and Par Tree Competitions remain the same and are awarded using three set divisions

Nine-hole qualifying Stableford competitions are treated as separate competitions with just one division.

Singles Event Prize Monies

Entry Fees for weekly Stablefords and Medals have been increased to £3.00 from January 2022. For more significant competitions such as the Club Championships and other Board Competitions, entry fees may be increased slightly but always advertised in advance.

90% of weekly competition fees is allocated for prize money. The remaining 10% covers the annual cost of trophy engraving.

In the event of ties where a trophy and prizes are shared the prize money is divided between winners (e.g. if a 1^{st} and 2^{nd} prize is normally awarded but there are two 1^{st} then the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} prize is combined and halved).

Competitions Held on a Non-Measured Course

The WHS rules indicate the alterations to the course which render it non-qualifying.

In general, the competition will be non-qualifying if there are any bucket holes.

Up to two temporary greens with standard sized holes are allowed in EG Medals.

Match Play Competition Requiring Play on Measured Course

Internal match play competitions, (including Brett, Wilson, and knockouts) must be played from the stone markers, indicating the measured course.

The tees for external match play competitions are stipulated within their rules but are generally the tees of the day (i.e., red markers) for SLCGA matches such as Pearson, Hicks, Centenary Bowl and Derry Cup.

Green Fees for External Match Play Competitions

If ladies are representing the Club, after qualifying by competition or by selection, their opponent(s) has the courtesy of our course (e.g., Daily Mail Foursomes). For other competitions the Club Secretary must be consulted, courtesy cannot be assumed.

Course Conditions for Internal Ladies Match Play Competitions

A maximum of four temporary greens, with or without bucket holes, is allowed for valid play in internal match play competitions. If there are more than four temporary greens, then the participants may still choose to play but it is not compulsory to do so and is a valid reason to rearrange a match without penalty should either competitor (or team) wish.

Club Prohibition of Match Play in Winter

Club rules prohibit internal two ball match play competition at the weekend in December and January, however, the Secretary has agreed that if a Singles match needs to be played during these months, they could be scheduled to play after 1.00pm or within the Ladies tee slots on a Sunday morning. Special permission is required from the Club Secretary for external match play during these months.

Internal Ladies Knockout Competitions Draw Rules

In the draw it is the responsibility of the player(s) listed higher to contact their opponent(s) and offer dates. This does not prevent the lower player(s) contacting their opponents, and in subsequent rounds the player (or team) that qualify second as they know their opponents immediately upon completion of their match should make the initial contact.

Players should offer several dates to their opposition and be considerate of the circumstances of opponents with respect to limited practical playing times, such as in the winter months. If any players have limited playing availability they are advised to plan ahead, even proposing provisional dates to possible future opponents. It is up to all players to comply with published closing dates and times for completion of rounds. It is hoped that most lady members will circulate their contact details, however, if they are not available, players can contact their opponents via the Puttenham Website Members Hub. Any problems arranging matches should be referred to the Ladies Competitions Secretary.

Use of Buggies

Use is permitted in all competitions except the Scratch Score Cup - Buggies may be used on one round only.

Use of Measuring Devices

Use in club competitions is only permitted for simple distance measurement.

Handicaps Handicap Divisions at Puttenham

A golfer's handicap index is a number assigned to him/her, which defines their skill/ability level. A handicap index gives all standards of golfers an opportunity to play together or compete against one another on an equal level. In a stroke play event, a golfer's playing handicap is deducted from his/her "gross" score (total shots taken) to provide a "nett" figure (total shots taken minus playing handicap). In a match play event, a player's playing handicap determines how many shots they will either give to, or receive from, an opponent.

For New Members and those regaining a handicap after lapse

The process to gain an initial handicap index is to complete three full cards of 18 holes or 6 cards of 9 holes or a combination of them both. The player must be accompanied by a "responsible person" and the cards must be signed by both the player and the marker. Retain the cards until all cards are completed and then hand them in to the Pro Shop, your handicap index will be allotted and you will be notified of the outcome.

If a new member joins the club having previously been a member of another WHS affiliated club (and having held a handicap index), they will be allocated the handicap index they last held. Players without a handicap index will follow the same process as for new players except that at the time of handicap allocation any previously held but lapsed handicap index will be taken into account.

If a lady member is new, she is required to have played a minimum of 3 qualifying rounds within the preceding 3 calendar months of date of play, to be eligible to enter.

Casual Round Scores

As well as playing competition rounds, players are allowed to enter Casual Round Scores to help maintain an accurate handicap index. These must be played under Competition Conditions (i.e., the course must be qualifying), they must be signed for in advance either via the Club V1 App, the PSI terminal or in the Pro's Shop and the scorecard must be signed by both the player and marker and returned immediately after play.

How do I improve my handicap index

A handicap index is calculated from the 8 lowest Scores (known as Score differentials), in your scoring record provided you have submitted a minimum of 20 qualifying scores. If a scoring record contains fewer than 20 Score Differentials, the table below is used to determine the number of Score Differentials to be included in the calculation and any adjustment that may apply. Round the result of the calculation to the nearest tenth.

Playing Safe and Staying Safe – COVID Guidance for Puttenham Members

Access to the course during the COVID Pandemic will be managed by Reception/Shop in line with Government guidance and current social distancing restrictions identified at the time. Likewise, the regulations in the Clubhouse and Bar area.

Members will be kept informed on a regular basis as restrictions change and would be expected to follow the current regulations identified.

- The Club Manager is our COVID Staff Officer who is responsible for managing such issues and queries.

Appendix I <u>Competitions and Trophies</u>

The Competition Secretary and Assistant are responsible for event organisation and trophy awards unless otherwise specified. Winners are either determined by review of cards (usual for pair's competitions), data provided by the handicap system for singles (sometimes in conjunction with a qualifying list such as Davies Trophy, or Grannies Trophy), competition result sheets (knockouts) or information gathered on the day (flag competition). Minimum entry numbers are specified next to competition information. Where closing dates are specified for knockout rounds these should be Tuesdays.

Trophy competition formats may change over time. If the presenter of the trophy is still contactable, they will be asked if they approve of the change, however the committee has final say on all competitions and trophies for the Ladies section.

Where not stated otherwise, competitions are roll-ups.

Non-Trophy Team Roll-up Competitions

These include Greensomes, Texas Scramble and Bowmakers. Texas Scramble and Bowmakers (best 2 of 3 Stableford scores) are played in teams of threes, according to roll up. Occasionally, pre-arranged/selected teams may be necessary depending on the competition, handicaps and number of players. There are specific rules for Texas Scrambles see Appendix.

Minimum entry: Greensomes 5 Pairs; Texas Scramble and Bowmaker 3 Teams.

National Competitions

Coronation Foursomes

Foursomes Stableford. Handicap Index Limit 40. Play off 50% of combined team handicap. Needs to be played by May. Organised by Peugeot. Winners go through to a Regional Final and winners of Regional Final to through to a National Final. Sign-up sheet will be on notice board at least 4 weeks prior to the competition. Winners go through to a regional final, and winners of the regional finals go to a national final.

Daily Mail Foursomes

Stableford Foursomes. The maximum number of shots a pair can claim with this calculation in this competition is 18 for men and 30 for women. Pairs whose calculated total is greater than these maximums can play, but can only claim up to these limits. Play off half combined team Course Handicap. Winners represent Club in regional Matchplay rounds. Needs to be played by September.

Annodata Matchplay

Puttenham submit one team of five in the women's championship. Ladies with playing handicaps must play off a maximum of 24 although those with handicaps above this are eligible to play in the tournament. Each team should consist of 5 players, and captains must exchange their teams and playing order before the commencement of the match (Team Sheets should be exchanged in Clubhouse before match). Once the teams have been exchanged no alterations are allowed. Teams: must be nominated in a 1-2-3-4-5 order for each match i.e.Competitor No. 1 of the home club must play competitor No. 1 of the visiting club. No. 2 plays No. 2 and so on.

Eliminating rounds will be on a Knock-Out basis with each match consisting of five singles decided by handicap match play over 18 holes. A winning game will count as one point and a game that finishes all square after 18 holes will count as a half-point. In the event of a match being tied 2½ - 2½ after the completion of the final two-ball, the designated No. 5 player must play a sudden-death handicap match starting on the tee from where the original match began and continuing hole-by-hole until there is a result.

Full difference between competing players handicaps will be taken as the basis for play. The player entitled to receive strokes will receive them at the appropriate holes shown on the official scorecard for the course. All players should produce their current handicap certificate for their opponents to see, if required. It is the players 'responsibility to check their respective handicaps and the shot allowance prior to teeing off in their match. Matches: A draw will be made for each round based upon club's geographical location. Clubs from different counties may be drawn to play each other from round one onwards. Clubs will be notified of their matches by email.

Ping 4 Ball Better Ball

A Pairs four ball better ball stableford competition with ladies receiving 90% of full handicap.

Entry fee: £5 per pair / Minimum: 3 pairs. Every club winner and runner up will receive a prize from PING, regardless of whether they get through to a final. Prizes will be sent out to all clubs after the closing date direct to the Club Professional. The top 50 club winners in England will qualify through to the GRAND FINAL. The next 50 best stableford scores will qualify for the PLATE FINAL. If over-subscribed there will be a waiting list.

Both finals will consist of 18 holes of Four Ball Better Ball stableford.

Puttenham to determine when to have the Qualifying competition but closing date for entry is end of July.

Ladies Competitions at Puttenham from 1st January 2024 Onwards

For players to be eligible to win a prize in a Ladies Club Competition (i.e stableford, medal, par etc), members are required to have submitted a minimum of 9 qualifying cards in the 12 months preceding the competition date. Please note that competition scores, and general play cards played at Puttenham Golf Club, or indeed any other course may count as a qualifying card.

For the avoidance of doubt, members may still compete in a Ladies Club Competition (except Knockout Matchplay Competitions – see below) should they not meet this requirement, but they would not be eligible to win a prize/prize money.

With regards to Knockout Matchplay Competitions this regulation will not only apply to winning a prize, but also entry into the event, and players handicap records will be checked prior to a draw being performed. This requirement should also be maintained throughout the members duration in a Knockout Matchplay Competition to be able to compete in each round.

Individual - One Day Only Competitions (HCI = Handicap Index)

Eclectic trophies

Every lady member is automatically entered in the Eclectic Competitions. The Eclectic runs twice a year; in Summer and Winter. The summer competition runs from 1st April to 30th September and the winter one from 1st October to 31st March. Every qualifying competition that takes place during these periods will be taken into account. The computer will identify the player's lowest score for each hole. A print out of your best scores will be regularly updated on the notice board. At the deadline date the scores are calculated and half your handicap is deducted to determine the winner in Division 1. Divisions 2 & 3 are combined for Eclectic therefore there will only be one winner from these 2 divisions combined.

Rules for Eclectic Competitions

The stated rules must be followed otherwise the eclectic score will be void.

- All players are automatically entered into the Eclectic Competitions
- Once player has entered a valid competition the card will automatically count for the eclectic.
- The winner is the player with the lowest nett score, calculated by adding the best scores per hole then subtracting half the handicap at the end of the eclectic competition. If there are no more eclectic qualifying competitions then the handicap on the last competition, whether weekend or weekday will be used. This means that an away score which suddenly brings down the handicap will not alter the result in the last few days.
- The first eclectic card can have any number of holes complete, but at the end of the eclectic competition period a score must have been returned for all holes.
- Scorecards must be put in the Competition Box even if there is no improved score or the entry is void.
- Scorecards must be put in the Competition Box on the same day as the round of golf.
- The following scorecards will be valid for the eclectic:
 - All individual qualifying club competitions (e.g. Par, Medal, Stableford). If, due to circumstances on the day, the competition is not valid for handicap purposes <u>it will still count for the Eclectic</u> (e.g. bucket holes). The card will still be entered in the eclectic if it qualifies for entry on your handicap register (see Handicap Notice) this includes cards where there is a minor mistake in scoring in Stableford or Par (which can be cross-checked against another card), or the player has played off too low a handicap.

Individual non-qualifying club competitions played off the red tees that are entered in the Handicap System (e.g. 3 Clubs and a Putter).

Non-returns will be valid if the rules of golf are followed and the card signed.

Scores will not count for the eclectic if the player is disqualified from the Competition (e.g. playing off too high a handicap, the card is not signed by the player and marker).

Resolving Ties for Eclectic

Winner - Lowest Eclectic Score minus ½ handicap at the close of the competition (denoted as Eclectic Handicap). If any number of players tie, take a back 9 calculation as follows until a winner is determined:

- Last 9 holes minus ¼ Eclectic Handicap. Last 6 holes minus ¼ Eclectic Handicap.
 - Last 3 holes minus γ_{12} Eclectic Handicap. Last 2 holes minus γ_{18} Eclectic Handicap.

Last hole minus $\frac{1}{36}$ Eclectic Handicap. If there is still a tie Toss a coin (single spin no hook or fade).

Results and Awards based on Handicap Data

The Pro Shop and Office are responsible for ensuring the production of results for:

- All Medals.
- All Stableford singles competitions 18 and 9 hole
- All Par competitions
- Specified non-qualifying Competitions such as 3 Clubs and a Putter, Tiger Tees.
- Birdie and Eclectic reports.

Where there is a special award with limited eligibility such as Davies Trophy or Mackenzie Cup (entry by qualification), Senior, Grannies Trophy or Flag Competition, the winner/eligible candidates must be indicated by the Competition Secretary, ensuring it is written on the player's card if notice is required on the results.

The Pro Shop provides handicap data for the Competition Secretary to enable:

- Determination of EG Medal awards, information to Secretary.
- Qualification for Davies and Mackenzie Competitions.
- Award of Nan Tuite Cup, Dixon Salver, Young at Heart Trophy.

A designated member of the Ladies Committee is responsible for entering the Ladies Section into the following competitions:

Local Texas Scramble Rules (Florida Scramble)

Teams of three players, 18 holes played as Medal from red tees of the day. Team handicap allowance is 10% of combined handicaps. Each team member must have 6 drives each. Indicate which player's drive is chosen by entering the score in the appropriate 'A', 'B' or 'C' column on the card.

Each player tees off and one drive is selected. The player whose ball is chosen will mark and lift their ball. Throughout the round the player whose ball is selected DOES NOT PLAY THE NEXT SHOT (except on the green). The other two

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players **TEE-UP** a ball within 6 inches of a marker on the fairway, or drop within 18 inches of the marker in the rough. If a ball chosen is in a bunker, the ball may be placed within 18 inches of the mark recreating the lie of the chosen ball as nearly as possible. IN ALL CASES THE BALL PLACED OR DROPPED MUST NOT BE NEARER THE HOLE THAN THE CHOSEN BALL.

Remember on the green all three players may putt. If you miss a putt you must mark the ball as another team player may hole out (Note: if the ball is tapped in, instead of being marked after a putt, that score counts).

Your gross score per hole is to be marked on the card under A, B, C then added for the 18 holes. The final score is the total, minus the exact team handicap.

If there are only two players then the following rules will apply:

- No restriction on the number of drives each player takes.
- All players may play every shot.
- Handicap allowance is 20% combined for two ball.

All balls (including chips) on the fairway (unless you are putting) must be teed-up within 6 inches of chosen ball not nearer the hole to protect the course.

(The office has a card template on club computer.)

Bowmaker Competition Rules

Teams of 3. Stableford, played off full handicap, with best two scores out of three to count.

- Responsible for new Lady Members Induction.

Amendments to the Puttenham Ladies Section Booklet between March 2020 – March 2022

Membership – As from 2021 Removal of 5-day Members and instead we now have just 7-day membership, Social, Village Club and the amalgamation of Flexi Gold, Flexi Silver and Points to just Flexible Points.

Friendly Matches are scheduled by a nominated member of the committee, not necessarily the Vice- Captain. With the full membership of the club from 2021, Ladies tee times on a Tuesday can move back on a sliding scale from 8.00 to 8.30 for 2-3 months to accommodate the Men's Tables in front. However as from 1st April, the Ladies timings on a Tuesday will revert to 8.30-10.30 every week due to very few ladies arriving between 8-8.30 and significant number of ladies arriving between 8.45 and 9.45.

A new Table now organised primarily for ladies started in 2021 on a Friday afternoon from 2.00pm. This provides the opportunity for 9 holes throughout the year and 18 holes when we have the light available. These are usually for fun competitions, however there will be opportunity for other identified events to take place during this period. During the COVID period the roll up system had to be abandoned in response to Government and England Golf Guidelines with organised Tee Times to allow for Social Distancing. However, the roll up system is now back in operation on a Tuesday. With Summer Daylight hours, the organised tee times published in advance on a Sunday will revert back to drawn cards at 9.45 from 1st April 2022.

The Introduction of the World Handicapping System in November 2020. This resulted in the following changes:

• It was agreed that all ladies should put in 6 Puttenham qualifying cards in the system in the 12-month period prior to any major competition. If a lady member was new, she would need to have entered 3 qualifying cards before being able to compete in a major / Board Competition.

• The introduction of ClubV1 & HowdidIdo has changed the way we enter competitions, receive results and pay entry fees.

COMPETITIONS

Entry Fees have been increased by the club from £2.50 to £3.00

Club competition winners are in divisions and prizes awarded on combined weekend and weekday play. If the course condition renders one of the singles competition days as non-qualifying and the other day is qualifying, then the days will be treated as separate competitions.

The allocation of players to divisions for the purpose of allocating prizes is based on the total numbers of players who have played over the two days, and the playing handicaps of those players. One division will be used it there is less than 30 players in total, and two divisions for 30 players and more. The number of players in each division will be made as equal as possible i.e if 40 players are competing then there would be as close to 20 players as possible in each division dependent on handicap levels. This would be calculated by the Golf Shop Team after the competition has been completed.

Prizes in the Ladies Eclectic and the Ladies Birdie Tree and Par Tree Competitions remain the same and are awarded using three set divisions

Nine-hole qualifying Stableford competitions are treated as separate competitions with just one division.

Competitions will be by entry on the VI App and/or Terminal. The Competitions Secretary will post forthcoming competitions on the Notice Boards in the ladies locker room with details/rules for each competition and a reminder of how to enter. Sign-up sheets may still be used for fun competitions when entry fees are not required to be deducted from individual club accounts.

3 Clubs and a Putter was moved from the Winter to May when it was felt the conditions were more conducive to having fewer clubs! A new trophy has been provided for this event to be awarded for the first time in 2022 A new Tiger Tee Plate was presented by DS for the Ladies yearly competition of the white tees, where previously there was no trophy.

It was agreed by a sub-committee of Sue Mant, Lorraine Toogood, Jayne Alderman and Debs Sparham, that The Mattie Trophy was now not fit for purpose.

The Ladies 4BBB Championship - following discussions with the Club, Sue Mant and the Ladies Committee, that this Championship should now take place on a Sunday to allow full inclusivity with weekend ladies now that everyone is a 7-day member.

Eclectic Competition – Winter Eclectic and Summer Eclectics now run concurrently due to results produced via ClubV1 (previously one month gap between them each end).

Scratch Match Play Salver 1990

Summer Knock-out competition played from 1st April to 30th September. Singles Match Play off scratch. Division 1. Maximum Course Handicap 20. Played off Red plates.

Match Play Cup 1964

Summer Knock-out competition played from 1st April to 30th September. Singles Match Play off full course Handicap difference. Division 1 and 2. Maximum Course Handicap 28. Played off Red plates.

Summer Knock-out competition played from 1st April to 30th September. Singles Match Play off full handicap difference. Division 2 and 3. Minimum Course Handicap 21 Maximum Course Handicap 54. Played off Red plates.
