INFORMATION BOOK FOR COMPETITION RULES

(Updated January 2025)

Definition of Senior

For the purpose of all Abbey Hill Golf Club (AHGC) Senior's competitions: Male Members of AHGC over the age of 55 on the start date of the competition and in possession of a WHS handicap index under the current WHS Handicapping Scheme.

General Rules for All Competition Entries

- All Competitions are to be played in accordance with the R&A Rules of Golf and Local Rules as approved
- Players handicaps must meet any specific conditions that may be set for any individual event
- Players must not be currently suspended from competition on the date of the competition
- Competitions will be posted on HowDidIDo (HDID) a minimum of 2 weeks before play date
- Entries must be submitted through HDID before the draws are made:-
 - \circ Draw for Tuesday competitions made 17:00 on Sunday before play date
 - \circ Draw for Thursday competitions made 13:00 on Monday before play date
 - \circ All competitions drawn at random with allowance for early, mid and late starts

Allowance may be made for late entries at the discretion of the Committee

- The appropriate entry fee must be paid before competitors commence their round or their first round in a multi-round competition
- If you are unable to play you must contact a member of the Committee asap (repeated instances may result in temporary suspension from competitions)
- The Starter and contact details will be identified on the published draw sheet
- You must register with the Starter at least 20 minutes before your tee time (failure to do so may result in penalty shots being administered or disqualification from competition)
- Score Cards must be completed correctly in accordance with the competition format:
 - o They must clearly identify the marker
 - Be signed by both player and marker after agreement of the scores by both
 - It must be submitted into the ClubV1 systems within one hour of the completion of your round.
 This may be done through the Player Score Input (PSI) terminal in the clubhouse or through the HDID app on a personal phone or other such device.
 - The cards must also be placed in the Senior's Competition box for possible scrutiny by the Committee
- Except where stated otherwise, all ties will be decided on the last 18, 9, 6, 3, or 1 hole in that order, unless a tie still results, in which case the last 6, 3, or 1 hole of the first 9 will count.
- In the event of any discrepancies or irregularities the Committee ruling will be final
- Members have the right of appeal should they disagree with a ruling or penalty imposed by the Committee. In the first instance this should be submitted to the Committee in writing stating their objection and reasons for this. This will be escalated for consideration to our representative at Berks, Bucks and Oxon Golf which is the regional organisation for our governing body, England Golf.

COMPETITION NAME:	THE A.J TROPHY
TYPE:	An Annual Competition
FORMAT:	Singles Match Play Knockout
ELIGIBILITY:	All members of the Senior Section possessing an official Handicap Index (HI) of 24.4 or less when the competition is posted. If your handicap is higher than 24.4 you must play off no higher than 24.4 for the duration of this competition. Should your HI reduce to below 24.4 then you will play off that handicap.
HANDICAP ALLOWANCE:	For each two-shot difference in Course Handicap the higher handicap player gets one-hole start. Odd differences in handicaps to be counted down. The Match is then played off scratch.
TEES:	Yellow
PERIOD OF COMPETITION:	February through to Final
ARRANGING MATCHES:	Throughout the competition the responsibility for arranging each match is shared equally between the players concerned. Failure to play a match within the applicable time frame may result in disqualification of both players.

The other players take the difference in their PH from the lowest. e.g. If Player A Handicap Index is 8.8 PH 5, B is 12.9 PH 9, C is 20.2 PH 16 and D is 27.5 PH 22. Player A gets 0 shots, player B gets 4 shots, player C gets 11 shots and player D gets 17 shots.

COMPETITION RULES

COMPETITION NAME: CHRISTMAS HAMPER 2024

PERIOD OF COMPETITION: Last two Thursdays in November and first two Thursdays in December. There will be a different format each week as laid out below.

HANDICAPS NOTE: All handicaps to be calculated from the unrounded course handicaps for individuals.

• HI-LO - STABLEFORD - 21.11.24

- Handicap Allowance
 - 4 Players 85%
 - 3 Players 100%
- Scoring The format is Stableford played in four balls wherever possible. High-Low Stableford Points with the highest and lowest scores being taken out of the best 3 scores. If you are a four ball the worst score can be ignored
- Example
 - Four ball Tom scores 4 points, Jack scores 2 points, John scores 1 point and Steve 0 points. The team selects the best 3 scores (4,2,1) then selects the highest and the lowest scores (4) and (1).
- o Example
 - Three ball Tom scores 4 points, Jack 2 points and Steve 0 points. The team selects the best 3 scores (4,2,0) and then selects the highest and lowest scores (4) and (0)

• AM-AM – STROKE PLAY – 28.11.24

- Handicap Allowance
 - 4 Players 85%
 - 3 Players 100%
- The format is Strokeplay played in four balls (see handicap allowance if you are a three ball). The best 2 net scores count on each hole. <u>All net scores for three balls and four balls count on the last hole</u>

• PINK BALL – STABLEFORD – 05.12.24

- o Handicap Allowance
 - 4 Players 85%
 - 3 Players 100%
- The format is played in teams of 4 (if you have only 3 players ask the Starter for a card for a three ball). On the first tee each team must allocate a Player Number to each Team Member **before teeing off.** Each player has been allocated the Pink Ball which is shaded.
- Scoring On each hole played, the "Pink Ball" score must count and be recorded in the Pink Ball column at the right-hand side of the card. The best score of the other three players must be recorded in the Best of the Rest column. For three balls the Pink Ball and the best of the rest can be the same. At the end of the game both Pink Ball and Best of the Rest scores are counted and added together. In the event of a tie the best Pink Ball total score wins using countback where necessary

• SCRAMBLE – 12.12.24

- Handicap Allowance
- 4 Players 25%/20%/15%/10% lowest to highest handicap (4 drives each)
- o 3 Players 35%/25%/15% lowest to highest handicap (5 drives each)

SCORING

The winners of each group will receive 3 points each, runners up 2 points each and 3rd place 1 point each. At the presentation the members with the most points will have 1st choice of a large selection of prizes (meat joints, beer, spirits, chocolates etc) with each point having a monetary value depending on the number of entries. You can choose multiple prizes laid out in points value to equate to the number of points you have accumulated. Any prizes left will be auctioned with all money going to the Captain's Charity
