Trophy Competitions

All Trophies can be played for on a Tuesday and Weekend day with the exception of

America Cup

Bronze Cup

Buller and Greasley Tankards

Grandmothers Trophy

Richards Cup

Harvey Cup

Hyman Cup

Veterans' Cup

Super Vets' Cup

Which are played for on Tuesdays only.

Other exceptions are Flag competition and The Sue Rance Trophy, which are played at the Weekend only.

N.B. For ladies playing in a Trophy Competition on both the Weekend and Tuesday, only the first score will count for the Trophy.

For Trophies played in conjunction with another competition only one entry fee will be levied. The overall winner will receive the Trophy for that year.

AMERICA CUP

18 hole Fourball better ball Stableford competition. Draw for partners. No handicap limit.

Date of competition to be as near as possible to 4th July (Independence Day).

Playing handicap of 85% of course handicap applies.

Donated by Frank & Bill ?. Originally a Men's Trophy played for from 1930-1940.

Taken over by the Ladies in 1950.

ASTOR CUP

18 hole stableford competition. No handicap limit. One division.

Presented by Viscountess Astor, past Club member. One division Stableford competition open to all Handicaps. Introduced in 1950

AUSTRALIA VASE

Awarded to the winner of the Bronze division stableford competition in July. No entry fee and no prize other than receiving the vase for one year.

Presented by Jackie Melville in 1968. Awarded to Bronze Div. winner of July Stableford comp.

BIRDIE CUP

Awarded to the lady with most birdies in Medal competitions between 1st October to 30th September

PRIZE: Pro Shop voucher.

Donated unknown – introduced in 1950.

BOGEY FINALS CUP

18 hole par or stableford competitions (alternate years). Open to winners/tied winners of par/stableford competitions from 1st January – 31st December in the previous year from all divisions. Played off current handicap - no limit.

No entry fee and no prize other than receiving the Cup for one year.

Donated unknown – introduced in 1987

BRONZE CUP

To be played as part of the Club Championship Day or on the preceding Tuesday if Championship Day is held at the weekend. 18 holes strokeplay for Bronze Division (HI 18.5 – 36.3). Ties decided on last 9, 6, 3 or 1 with no player taking more than one prize.

Play in strict handicap order.

BULLER & GREASLEY TANKARDS HIGH/LOW FOURSOMES STABLEFORD

A competition to introduce experienced members and beginners to each other.

Ladies' Captain draws one low handicap lady and one high handicap lady to play as partners. No handicap limit. Half combined handicaps.

Originally just the Buller tankard, owned by member Mrs. P Buller and donated after her death to be played as a Stableford for 30+ handicaps in 1990. It was joined 7 years later by past Ladies' Captain Mrs Marjorie Greasley's tankard in 1997 again donated after her death. Both lady members used to keep their tankards at the Club to drink from. The competition was then changed to a Hi/Low Foursomes draw for partners. Introduced in 1961

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

36 holes stroke play competition open to Silver Division players (HI up to 18.4) who have completed a minimum of 54 holes qualifying competitions at Burnham Beeches Golf Club from the 1st of January in the current year. Places may be limited because of availability on the combined Championship Day, in which case places will be allocated in strict handicap order.

In the event of a tie for first Scratch there will be a play-off (stroke play) over holes 1, 2 and 9 and if still a tie, the Champion will be decided by 'sudden death' over the same three holes.

All other ties to be decided on the last 18, 9, 6, 3 or 1 holes. No player to take more than one prize.

Play in strict reverse handicap order.

N.B. If Championship Day is held on a weekend, players may also enter a separate medal competition for Silver division held on the same Tuesday as the Bronze Cup.

Introduced in 1948

COPPER TROPHY

18 hole stroke play event for players with a Handicap Index of 27.9 and over played in conjunction with a nominated Medal.

No additional entry fee required for the Trophy and no prize other than receiving the Trophy for one year.

CYGNETS TROPHY

This is a County Trophy played in conjunction with a stableford competition. Entry fee set by the County. Best six scores submitted to County in three categories and trophy awarded to the winning Club at the County AGM.

ENGLAND GOLF MEDAL WINNER

Presented to the player with the best 4 nett medal scores over the year. The memento will be issued by England Golf to be presented at P.A.T. in February

The winners goes forward to play in a regional final. Further information is available on the England Golf website

GRANDMOTHERS' TROPHY

18 hole competition run in conjunction with a stableford competition. No handicap limit.

Presented in 2002 by the family of Dr. Mai Adcock, past Ladies' Captain.

HARVEY CUP

18 hole strokeplay competition for players with Handicap Indices of between 27.9 and 36.3

N.B. This Competition can be played on the same day as the Richards Cup (HI limit up to 27.8).

Donated unknown – introduced in 1950. Rabbit embossed on Cup for Handicaps 30+

HUMPHREYS-OWEN CUP

18 hole stroke play competition held in conjunction with a Medal.

Open to winners and tied winners from both divisions, selected from combined field in medal competitions in a calendar month, not per individual competition, from 1st Jan – 31st Dec of the previous year. No entry fee and no prize other than receiving the Cup for one year.

Donated by club member Mrs Humphreys-Owen originally as a Team Challenge Cup against other local Golf Clubs from 1934-1952. Cup stayed at Burnham Beeches and was changed to club medal play in 1955.

HYMAN CUP

18 hole medal competition. HI limit 27.8.

Donated unknown – introduced in 1928.

MACKENZIE SALVER

18 hole stroke play competition – played in conjunction with the October medal.

Open to winners and tied winners of any competition which awards Victor Ludorum points. (1st Oct – 30th Sept) and also open to the Club Champion and Bronze Cup winner.

No entry fee and no prize other than receiving the Salver for one year.

Donated in 1991 by Ladies' Past Captain Mrs Jean Mackenzie for winner of winners

MORGAN CUP

18 hole stroke play competition. HI limit 27.8.

N.B. This Competition can be played in combination with another Cup/Trophy where Handicap Index Limit is different, i.e. Copper Trophy

Donated in 1948 by Mrs A de W Morgan, Ladies' Captain in 1946. Medal play.

NOBLE SALVER

Awarded to the winner of nominated Medal, played in August – bronze division.

HI 18.5 to 36.3 only. No entry fee and no prize other than receiving the salver for one year.

Donated in 1948 by members Alice and Len Noble to the Ladies' Bronze Division. It was given to the Nobles to celebrate their Diamond Wedding.

RICHARDS CUP

18 hole medal competition. HI limit – 27.8.

N.B. This Competition can be played on the same day as the Harvey Cup

The oldest Cup in the Ladies' section donated by Mrs Richards, Ladies Honorary Secretary in 1922. Medal play

SCRATCH CUP

Awarded to the lady with the lowest aggregate of the best six scratch scores in Medal competitions.

Ties to be decided on the most recent 18 hole Medal.

PRIZE: Pro Shop voucher.

Donated unknown – introduced in 1971

SUPER VETS' CUP

18 hole stableford competition for ladies 70 and over, to be played in conjunction with Veterans' Cup.

No handicap limit. No entry fee and no prize. Winner receives Cup for one year.

Donated by Mrs Bea Hall, Past Ladies Captain in 2006

SUE RANCE TROPHY

One Division. Stableford competition played on a Weekend day in August.

Donated by Sue's husband John Rance in 2014. In memory of Sue who died in 2013

VETERANS' CUP

18 hole stableford competition for ladies aged 55 and over. Played in conjunction with a stableford competition and the Super Vets' Cup. A lady of 70 or over will win the Veterans' Cup if she comes in with the best score. No Handicap limit.

Donated unknown – introduced in 1957.

Other Individual Competitions

BRING AND WIN COMPETITION

9 or 18 hole "one division" stableford competition. No handicap limit. Each player to bring small gift and place it on the dining room table before playing.

Only those competitors attending tea qualify for choice of prize. Ties to be decided by drawing playing cards.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S DAY

Format at the discretion of the Club Captain. Dependent on the format winners and tied winners from both divisions may qualify for either the Humphreys/Owen Cup or the Bogey Finals Cup. No entry fee. Prizes decided and donated by the Club Captain.

FLAG COMPETITION

18 hole one division competition. No handicap limit. When a player has used all their stroke allowance, the position of ball is marked by a named flagstick.

NB: This competition is played at the weekend with the men as a separate competition.

JOKER STABLEFORD

18 hole competition. Before going out to play, entrants select three joker holes on both the front 9 and back 9 and ring them on the scorecard. Stableford scores for the joker holes are doubled, and the remainder are scored as normal.

Scores may also be submitted for handicap purposes. This requires the entrant to register in the PSI system before going out to play.

LADIES' CAPTAIN'S DAY

Format at the discretion of the Ladies' Captain. Dependent on the format winners and tied winners from both divisions qualify for either the Humphreys/Owen Cup or the Bogey Finals Cup. No entry fee. Prizes decided and donated by the Ladies' Captain.

MONTHLY MEDALS (Minimum of 4, Maximum of 24)

18 hole strokeplay round. Ladies may enter Medals without paying an entry fee, being eligible for Handicap and Victor Ludorum points but not for prizes.

When a medal is played in a month, there must be one on a weekday and one on a weekend. They do not have to be in the same week.

ONE DAY ECLECTIC

Stableford competition. From 18 holes played, players select their best 9 holes made up of: 3 * par 3s, 4 * par 4s and 2 * par 5s.

These scores are to be ringed on the scorecard and the total for these 9 holes added up.

Scores may also be submitted for handicap purposes. This requires the entrant to register in the PSI system before going out to play.

PROFESSIONAL'S PRIZE

Format at the discretion of the Club Professional. Dependent on the format winners and tied winners for both divisions qualify for either the Humphreys/Owen Cup or the Bogey Finals Cup. Entry Fee applies. Prizes decided by the Professional.

TURKEY TROT

18 hole "one division" stableford competition. No handicap limit

Prizes: Vouchers presented at the Christmas lunch.

Pairs Competitions

DOVETAIL COMPETITION

18 hole "one division" 2 Ball Better Ball. Full handicap. Each player to count on 9 out of 18 holes. The score for each hole must be decided before leaving each green.
Can be Draw for Partners at the discretion of the Ladies Captain.

PING COMPETITION (Qualifying round to be played between 1 Jan and 31 July)

A fourball betterball competition.

Entry fee and conditions of competition set by Ping and England Golf.

N.B. Winners may qualify for Grand or Plate Finals, depending on their score.

HIT, SWITCH & PICK COMPETITION

Greensomes handicap, no handicap limit.

Both players "hit" (i.e. drive off the tee), then "switch" to hit partners ball for second shot, then "pick" the ball to play next. Then play alternate shots until hole is complete and record total score for hole.

Three Ball Competitions

ALLIANCE COMPETITION

A three ball draw for partners 18 hole stableford competition.

Captain draws one low, one medium and one high handicapper to play together. Full handicap.

Best two scores on each hole to be counted.

TEXAS SCRAMBLE

18 hole strokeplay competition with 3 players per team, any combination of handicap, team handicap is 1/6th of combined course handicaps. Handicap parameters at Ladies' Captain's discretion.

Each team must nominate a captain and use a minimum of 4 drives per player.

All players drive on every hole and the team captain decides whose ball to play next. The ball is marked then that player stands to one side and the other two play from this position. The same procedure applies until the green, where the ball chosen is marked by a putter head length and the other two players putt from the same spot in turn. If the ball is in a hazard or in the rough, the other balls must be dropped not placed and played from this position.

YELLOW BALL COMPETITION

18 hole stableford competition, either a 3 ball draw for partners or players to select partners of choice (at Ladies' Captain's discretion) Full handicap.

The yellow ball moves to each player in turn who has the opportunity to double her score for that hole.

The best two scores count on each hole. If the yellow ball is lost the team may continue to score as normal but can no longer double any score for the remainder of the round.

WALTZ STABLEFORD COMPETITION

Full handicap, 18 hole stableford competition, teams of 3

1 score on 1st hole, 2 scores on 2nd hole, (all) 3 on 3rd hole, then just one to score on 4th hole, etc.

Foursomes and Greensomes Competitions

AUSTRALIAN SPOONS

Played from 1st November to 31st May inclusive. Handicap Index 15 and above

An annual foursome competition played in each county in Great Britain for a pair of spoons presented by the Australian Ladies' Golf Union.

May be played at any time and the best scoring team results submitted for inclusion into the inter club competition. Rules and entry fee as advised by organiser.

N.B. to Organisers/Diary – Try and play qualifying round January or February because more than one entry is allowed up to the closing date

CAPTAIN V SECRETARY MATCH

Greensomes match play. Calculated as 0.6 x lower handicap plus 0.4 x higher handicap. Full handicap difference applies.

No entry fee but losing pair pay for opponents' tea.

Maximum of one shot per hole to be given.

CORONATION FOURSOMES

18 hole foursomes stableford competition to determine the pair to represent the Club (if their score is good enough) in the Regional Final (choice of venue).

No handicap limit. ½ combined handicaps.

ENTRY : As set by England Golf (to whom it is sent together with the results).

PRIZES : Mementoes are awarded by the sponsor to winning club pair.

Established in 1953 to commemorate the Queen's coronation and organised by the R&A. The best 100 scores based on nett differential will qualify for the Regional Final. Then the 16 winners of the Regional Final qualify for the Grand Final at St. Andrews.

EASTER BOXES

Draw for partners. Greensomes Stableford competition at Easter. No handicap limit. Greensomes handicap.

Donated by Jenny Snowden in 2006 to be played for at Easter as draw for partners Greensomes Stableford. Was changed in 2007 to winners of individual stablefords in Silver and Bronze division. As requested by Jenny, changed back to draw for partners in 2016

MEDLEY COMPETITION

A pairs Competition format which is:-

Six holes Four Ball Better Ball

Six holes Greensomes

Six holes Foursomes

Stableford scoring for each section.

First six holes (4BBB) each player plays off their own individual handicaps.

For the next twelve holes (Foursomes/Greensomes) each pair to play off half of combined handicap.

(This was changed in 2015 from - 'medley' handicap of 0.5 of the lower handicap plus 0.4 of the higher. This was a special formula for this competition only.)

SPRING MEETING

18 hole greensomes stableford starting from 1st and 10th tees followed by lunch.

Handicap allowance calculated as 0.6 x lower handicap plus 0.4 x higher handicap.

Knockout Competitions

Knock-out competitions open to Full Members only with exception of High/Low Greensomes.
For all Knock-outs competitors must have an up-to-date Handicap Index

CLUB SINGLES - SUMMER

A knockout handicap singles matchplay competition run during the summer months with matches over 18 holes. HI limit 27.8. Final to be played in time for the winner to compete in the MacKenzie Salver (beginning of October)

PRIZES: Winner and Runner up

Donor unknown – introduced in 1932

CLUB SINGLES – WINTER (ATKINSON CUP)

A knockout handicap singles matchplay competition (Trophy also known as Atkinson Cup) run during the winter months with matches over 18 holes. HI limit 27.8.

PRIZES: Winner and Runner up

Presented by Mrs I Atkinson, past Club member in 1960. Singles Knockout played throughout the winter.

LADIES' FOURSOMES

A knockout handicap foursomes competition run during the summer months with matches over 18 holes. HI limit 31.2. Stroke allowance is half the difference of the combined handicaps in accordance with WHS rules. (Appendix C)

PRIZES: Winners & Runners up

N. B. Winners qualify as the club representatives in the "Daily Mail Foursomes". The Club pays the entry fee.

A pair of silver vases donated by past members, Marjorie Greasley and Phyllis Rellie to winners of a ladies foursome competition started in 1962. Now they are awarded to the Ladies Summer Foursomes Knock-out.

HIGH / LOW GREENSOMES (Centenary Rose Bowl)

A knock-out greensomes competition, where ladies of lower handicaps partner ladies of higher handicaps. The handicap limits (for high and low) will be determined by the number of ladies playing. There should be at least a 4 shot difference between playing partners.

Greensomes handicap allowance is calculated for each team and full difference applies.

Played from February until the final in October.

PRIZES: Winners & Runners up

Introduced in 2005 as Hi/Lo Betterball Knockout by then Ladies Captain, Mrs Maria Brown. Changed 2 years later to a Greensomes Knock-out.

Mixed Competitions run by the Ladies' Section

BUCKS & DOES

A friendly Greensomes match between Ladies 'Does' and Gentlemen 'Bucks'.

Played off the men's card & ladies receive 3 courtesy shots added to their handicap. Ladies' Captain agrees the number of 'bisques' (a stroke which may be taken at any hole and deducted from the score, but it must be declared prior to leaving the green) with the Chief Buck and agrees pairings with the Chief Buck. No entry fee but the participants are expected to attend and pay for the dinner following the match.

VICTOR LUDORUM

Started by Mrs Joy Robie, in her year as Ladies Captain in 1963 for the most successful player during the year with points given to winners of medals, stablefords & trophy competitions. This is intended to reward the most consistent and improving member.

Competitions contributing Victor Ludorum points are

Astor Cup	Medals

In addition, the format of the Club Captain's competitions, the Ladies' Captain's competition and the Professional's competition are at the discretion of the sponsor. If the competition format is appropriate, then Victor Ludorum points will be awarded in line with the system outlined below.

Points are awarded for **NET** results from 1st October – 30th September as follows:-

All qualifying competitions played where an overall winner is declared i.e. Medals, Pars, Stablefords, Trophies.	Winner	2 points
	Runner – up	1 point
Note: - Victor Ludorum points are for the best 1st and 2nd net across the divisions.		
Summer Singles & Winter Singles	Winner	4 points

Victor Ludorum points will be allocated to the best net scores achieved in each calendar month, not per individual competition.

i.e. Weekend and weekday results will be combined for Victor Ludorum purposes only.

If there is a TIE for a winner of any of the above then ALL TIED receive the winner's Victor Ludorum points and in that case there are no runner's-up points awarded. Similarly, if there is a TIE for runner-up in any of the above then ALL TIED receive the runners-up points.

Cup to be shared in the event of a tie.

NO ENTRY FEE

PRIZE: Pro's Shop voucher.

ECLECTIC COMPETITIONS

SUMMER: County Competition

Proceeds donated go to County Captain's chosen charity

DATES: beginning April to mid September (see BBGC diary or county website for exact dates).

RULES: A competitor must enter via the Club v1 system.
The first card returned must be from a completed competition round. Stableford and par scores are accepted without all holes completed.
Thereafter, a minimum of four holes to be played per card returned.

Competition scores may be entered into the PSI Terminal or via the app. and cards placed into the boxes by the terminals. Scores from casual (single strokeplay) rounds can also be submitted by putting signed cards or eclectic entry slips into the box in the ladies' locker room

RESULTS: After the closing date of the competition, each competitor's best score on every hole will be added up to give a total gross score over 18 holes. A reduction of half the competitor's course handicap will then be made and the winner will be the competitor with the lowest nett score. In the event of a tie, the winner will be decided by a card countback of the nett scores over the last nine, six, three or one holes of the final Eclectic score card.

ENTRY: Determined by county

PRIZE:CLUB awards best nett (and ties) in two Divisions.
Prize to the value of £10 for each Division.

The BCLGA Eclectic Cup is awarded to the Club with the lowest aggregate score. The seven lowest net scores and a cheque for total entry money are forwarded to the County Treasurer as soon as the competition is closed.

NB: There should be 2 weeks given between the start and finish of the Winter and Summer Eclectic

WINTER: Club competition

RULES & CLUB PRIZES: as Summer Eclectic

DATES: beginning October to end March (see BBGC diary for exact dates).

ENTRY: £3 for first card with no charge thereafter.
All donations to go to the Ladies' Captain's chosen charity.

PRIZE:CLUB awards best net (and ties) in two Divisions.
Prize to the value of £10 for each Division.

SCORE counting towards the ECLECTIC competition is deemed to be valid when temporary greens are in use. All Club Prizes are donated from the Ladies' Section funds.

Acceptable Scores

For further information on scores acceptable for handicapping purposes please refer to Rule 2.1 of the WHS Rules of Handicapping (Jan 2020) available from the R&A or England Golf Website.

Handicaps and Handicap Divisions

As per the WHS Rules of Handicapping document, players are responsible for ensuring their handicap index and course handicap are recorded on their scorecards.

Handicap allowances for different formats of competition can be found in the WHS Rules of Handicapping Appendix C

Where handicap divisions are used, these are defined as follows:

Silver – HIs up to 18.4

Bronze – HIs from 18.5 to 27.8 inclusive

Copper – HIs of 27.9 and above

No Returns (N/R)

Some players playing Medal Competitions believe that, because their score return for the Competition becomes an "NR" when they fail to record a score on even one hole, they do not need to return their scorecard nor enter their scores. This is not true and the WHS Rules of Handicapping contains specific guidance on this (Rules 3 and 4)

Players should therefore ensure that they **ALWAYS** return their scorecard in all competitions, even if some holes are not completed.
