

General Committee Meeting 6 Nov 1915

Minutes of previous meeting read and confirmed.

House Committee Report. The question of decorating the kitchen was left open until next month. M^r Glazebrook was asked to obtain samples and prices of linoleum for covering the kitchen floor.

Greens Committee Report.

It was decided to order sufficient vermol (1½ tons) to treat all the greens, not to cost £10

M^r Morris gave notice that at the next meeting he would propose a local rule be adopted giving the option of replaying a stroke which hits the fence surrounding a green.

It was decided that the lower end of the green 12 be banked up.

M^r C P Glazebrook was appointed a member of the Greens and Handicap Committees.

It was arranged that during the winter months the men should start work at 8.30 a.m. and finish at 4 p.m. during December and January but that in future they should work until 6 p.m. through the months when daylight lasts that long
