General Committee Meeting Thursday July 15th 43.

The minutes of last meeting held June 17th were read and adopted.

The secretary reported regarding the interview between M^r Bowler, the secretary of the Farmers Union and M^r R Wood and himself, and M^r Wood explained the position. It was decided that M^r Bowler be offered the sum of £40 in settlement of all claims, such offer to be made in writing – the letter to be approved by the Captain, M^r Wood and the Secretary.

A letter was received from the Treasurer of the local St John and Red Cross Brigade acknowledging the donation of £11-0-0 from the Captain's Prize Day Effort.

The Minutes of the Handicap, House and Greens Committees were passed as read.
