## **Meeting of the Greens Committee 7 July 1913**

Present: M<sup>r</sup> Parnaby preside. Messrs R Brown, H G Hall H H Knight and D<sup>r</sup> Ross.

It was decided to arrange for thw following work to be done;-

- 1) Mow on every day possible. Scythe in the hollows and cut for 20 yards in front of the greens.
- 2) Level the ehdge at the approach to the 15<sup>th</sup> green and fill up on either side.
- 3) At the 17<sup>th</sup> green, the grass to be cut in the hollows and all holes to be filled up.
- 4) Decided to employ an extra man for a month scything.
- 5) Improve approach to the 3<sup>rd</sup> green and grass to be raked off and both sides scythed.
- 6) Mow and sythe in front of 4<sup>th</sup> tee.
- 7) Spread soil in the big bunker in front of the last green.
- 8) Sythe round hedge at the 14<sup>th</sup> fairway.
- 9) Sythe in the hollow at the 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> and all furrows down the 8<sup>th</sup> fairway.
