

Committee Meeting June 5th 1924.

Present: J Lohead in the Chair.

Mess^{rs} W H Andrew, H Slatter, F Moss, J C Payne, and J Gibson.

Minutes of last meeting were read and passed.

The following:- duly nominated and seconded were passed for membership. M^r Leonard Whitehead, M^r J T Wallwork, M^r Sidney King, M^{rs} A C Hough, Miss G M Woodcock, "full members" and M^r Archer Miller for Country Membership.

The following accounts were passed for payment:- S Travis 3/16/6, T Maclean 26/-/-, Stamford Estate Ground Rent 31/17/6, J Andrew & Co 2/17/6, Mess^{rs} Williamson & Ball 22/8/2. Total £86-19-2.

It was decided that three more bamboo flag poles be ordered.

In connection with the treatment of Greens etc. and the use of fertilizer and worm killer, it was decided that the Secretary communicate with M^r Green of Mess^{rs} Williamson and Ball asking him to visit the Club and satisfy himself that proper use was being made of the fertilizer etc.

The Secretary reported that M^r H Ridyard and himself had inspected and tried three horses and had decided on one and that he had purchased same for £26, the seller to take the old one as part of the bargain. The Secretary's action was approved and it was decided that a letter be sent to M^r Ridyard thanking him for his willing assistance in this matter.

It was decide to approve of the Secretary's action in selling the old roller for 15^s/-.

The question of a Triple Horse Mower was discussed and it was decided not to purchase one at present.

A letter was read from the County Police in reference to subscriptions for the Annual Sports and it was decided to give £2-2-0 as in previous years.

Mess^{rs} Lohead and Slatter gave particulars of interview with Gledhill and others in reference to freeing the Course from cattle and it was agreed that they should obtain all the information possible with a view to bringing about the desired result.

It was decided that the Secretary write the Lan^c Golf Union regarding the custom or otherwise of Captain's and Secretary's being allowed the privilege of the Green as regards the Union.
