General Committee Meeting Wednesday July 4th 28.

The meeting was called to receive a deputation from the Ladies Committee to discuss some method of dealing with the social accommodation required for the increasing number of lady members "at the request of the Ladies Committee". The ladies were asked by the Captain to state their views and in response they stated that from their point of view, the lady members required more accommodation in the way of a decent sized room that would be separate from the men's room; they felt to some extent they were intruders in the present Club Room and that additional accommodation would solve the difficulty.

It was generally agreed that there was a lack of accommodation, and but that the financial position of the Club certainly did not warrant any serious expense at present.

The ladies stated that they were prepared to undertake the raising of funds towards increasing accommodation, but when asked if it would affect the yearly amount handed over by them to the Club Funds, they were not quite clear, but it seemed evident that they had intended to use this amount in raising a fund.

It was pointed out that the Club Premises belonged to M^r Kenworthy and that permission would have to be obtained for any alterations.

The Captain stated that the Committee would carefully consider what the ladies had said; that it was the desire of the Committee to provide suitable accommodation, but that he could not hold out much hope at present owing to the financial position of the Club.

Several suggestions relative to alterations and providing increased accommodation were made and the matter was then left with the Committee to consider the question at a later date.
