## Special General Meeting: Saturday 9th July 1932.

Present: M<sup>r</sup> G Robson the Captain in the Chair and 54 members.

The Meeting was called on a requisition "signed by 26 members" asking for a special General Meeting to consider the question of the provision of Caddies on Sundays and the meeting was called for the sole purpose of considering this question.

The Captain, M<sup>r</sup> Robson opened the meeting. M<sup>r</sup> Payne moved the resolution: - that we employ Caddies on Sundays, this was seconded by M<sup>r</sup> V Kay and supported by M<sup>r</sup> G Hough and several members spoke in favour.

A good many members took part in the discussion which followed and many spoke against the resolution.

M<sup>r</sup> W H Andrew moved an amendment: - that it be a recommendation to the Committee to consider the advisability of employing Caddies on Sundays and this was seconded by M<sup>r</sup> R Wood.

Several members were against this and preferred that the question should be decided by the meeting and on request, M<sup>r</sup> Andrew withdrew his amendment.

It was then moved, seconded and carried that voting be by ballot.

Scrutineers were appointed and the Ballot taken and the result of the voting was as follows: - 21 voted in favour of the resolution and 32 against. The resolution therefore failed.

A vote of thanks to the Captain for presiding concluded the meeting.
