

General Committee Meeting Thursday March 12th 36.

Present: E Raines in the Chair.

The Minutes of last meeting held February 13th were read and adopted.

The following duly nominated and seconded were passed for membership by ballot subject to their names being posted for the required period: - D^r A J Ross, W Brown and Sydney Hoyle.

The following resignations were accepted: - G Taylor, G O Moseley, H M Newton and M^{rs} Newton, D^r R Bleasdale, and Arthur England, Jun^r Member.

In the case of D^r Bleasdale, it was decided that the secretary write thanking him for his valuable services, especially in the early days of the Club's existence and to say that his resignation was accepted with regret.

In the case of H M Cooper who wished to know if he could be transferred to Country Member, it was decided that the secretary inform him that unless he was a member of another club, they could not accept him as a Country Member.
