

**General Committee Meeting Thursday Aug 11<sup>th</sup> 32.**

Present: R Bennett in the Chair.

Mess<sup>rs</sup> W H Andrew, H Ridyard, J Taylor, E S Jones, H L Boardman, F Moss, R Wood and J Gibson.

The Minutes of last meeting held July 14<sup>th</sup> were read and passed.

The question of admission of Sons or daughters of members for a period of say three months at a nominal fee was discussed and it was decided that in such cases, Monthly Tickets could be taken out and the restriction regarding the two visits per year be waived.

The following accounts were passed for payment: - Herbert Ellis 3/8/0, Ransomes, Sims & Jefferies 10/-, J W Burton & Son 1/0/6, Williamson & Ball 8/9, Royal Insurance Co "Employers Liability" 3/11/6. Total £9-4-9.

The Minutes of the House, Handicap and Greens Committee were passed as read.

The following resolution was passed: - That M<sup>r</sup> J Taylor be, and is hereby authorised to sign cheques on behalf of the Social Committee.

The Secretary read two letters from the parents of boys accused of golf ball stealing and it was decided to let the matter rest.

The Secretary pointed out that the Nomination Form for Captain, Committee etc. had to be posted not later than the last Saturday in August, viz:- August 27<sup>th</sup> also that there were four vacancies on the Committee. Three for 3 years and one for 1 year.

The Social Secretary, M<sup>r</sup> J Taylor reported that his committee had held 5 raffles altogether and that a small sweep had taken place; also that the profit on the Gymkhana would amount to about £50.

The Social Committee suggested that the Gymkhana be not held next year owing to the scanty success.

In regard to the suggested Dance in the Palais, the Committee were not in favour.

It was agreed that the £50 be paid by the Social Committee to the General Funds.

It was decided that M<sup>r</sup> H Ridyard be appointed a member of the Social Committee in place of M<sup>r</sup> J C Payne, resigned.

Reference was made to the lack of heat in the Large Room and certain suggestions were made and it was left with the House Secretary and General Secretary to go into the question.

It was decided to grant permission for the Social Committee to hold a sweep if desired.

The question of Caddies and going out on two rounds was discussed and it was decided that when a member asks for a Caddie for two rounds, the first Caddie on turn who is prepared to go out on two rounds be supplied, independent of his turn in the list.
