In connection with the proposed alteration of Telephone poles near the Club House, the Secretary stated that he had interviewed the telephone Cos. Engineer and objected to their proposal; and had suggested a way out so as not to interfere with the view. It was decided to leave the question to be decided by the Secretary.

## Special Committee Meeting. Wednesday May 30<sup>th</sup> 23.

The meeting was called to deal with the Ballot respecting "Sunday Golf" and arrange according to the result of the vote.

The voting resulted as follows:- 92 Votes in favour and 61 against giving a majority for Sunday Golf of 31.173 Ballot papers were sent out and 153 were returned completed. It was decided to open the Club House and the Links each Sunday on and after June 10<sup>th</sup> 23.

It was moved by J H Taylor, seconded by Reg Bennett that the Green Fee for each visitor on Sundays be 3<sup>s</sup>/-. ( Carried.)

It was moved by H Slatter, seconded by F L Eaton that meals be provided on Sundays by the Caretakers. An amendment was moved by Reg Bennett seconded by Ja<sup>s</sup> Lochead that no meals be provided. On being put to the meeting the resolution to provide meals was carried.

It was decided that no caddies be allowed on the links on Sundays, moved by Reg Whitworth, seconded by J Gibson.

It was decided to grant a half days holiday each week to M<sup>r</sup> & M<sup>rs</sup> Nield in consideration of the extra work involved in opening on Sundays.
