General Committee Meeting Thursday July 11th 29

Present: F Moss in the Chair.

The Minutes of the last meeting and three Special Meetings were read and passed.

The following duly nominated and seconded were passed for membership: - Mr^s W E Kemp and Miss B Rollinson.

A letter from Miss Spencer was read.

A letter from Mess^{rs} Faulkner, Tanner, Barker and Dale complaining about standing rights on the Course was read and Mess^{rs} Faulkner and Dale were interviewed and the position explained as follows: - Members leaving the Course and afterwards returning to continue their game must give way to following players.

The Secretary reported that M^r Dennis Bottomley had complained of the loss of a new blazer "taken from the locker room", enquiries had been made with no result. It was decided that nothing further could be done in the matter.

M^r E S Jones explained matters in regard to the late payment of accounts in connection with the shop.

The Minutes of the Handicap Committee were read and approved.

The shortage of Golf Score Cards was discussed and it was decided that a supply be printed in the emergency and that a goodly supply be printed for the future, same to be left with M^r Andrew and the Secretary.
