

General Committee Meeting Thursday June 11th 1936.

Present: E Raines in the Chair.

The Minutes of last meeting held May 14th were read and adopted.

The following duly nominated and seconded were passed for membership by ballot:- Reginald Holmes, Leslie S Ashton, Joseph Hague, M^{rs} P McCarthy, Miss Roberts, M^{rs} W McCarthy, and Marian Elson, and M^{rs} L S Ashton for honorary membership.

The following accounts were passed for payment: - Stamford Estate 45/-/-, S Sidebottom Ltd 5/6/5, J Waterhouse & Co 3/2/11, J W Hall Ltd 2/0/7, Jones Music Shop 15/-, Total £56-4-11.

A letter from the Officers Mess was read stating that they would be sorry to sever their connection with the Club and accepting the proposal to pay £7/10 per annum during such time as they only have a few players. The Committee thanked the Secretary for his services in this matter.

A letter from the Ladies Committee was read stating that in answer to the secretary's letter they had passed a resolution that the Ladies allow the Gentlemen "right of way" on Saturdays and that they would post a notice to this effect.

The suggestion book was produced and contained the suggestion that the steps leading up to the Gents Locker Room receive attention as they were considered dangerous. It was decided that this matter receive attention.
