

**General Committee Meeting held on  
Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> June 1952**

The Minutes of the last Meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> May were read and adopted.

Minutes of the Handicap, House & Greens Committee were approved as read.

The following resignation was accepted with regret: M<sup>r</sup> W Townsend.

The Steward attended the Meeting having been duly appointed on June 8<sup>th</sup> 1952.

It was agreed to engage the Sister of the Steward to serve in the Bar on Monday evenings at a cost of 10/- per week.

The Secretary reported that the Bungalow Range had been fitted in the Stewards Living Room.

Estimates were read from three Builders with regard to Repairs to Windows in upper lounge, New Gutters below Bay Window and New Stair Treads. After discussion on the matter it was agreed that the Quotation received from H Kay, Builders & Contractors 7 Freeman Road Dukinfield, at a price of £107-0-0 be accepted and the Secretary was instructed to write to the Builder to that effect.

It was reported by the Secretary that private articles of Clothing & Bedding belonging to the late Steward had been sent to the Laundry and these had been paid for by the Club, to the amount of £1-14-0. After discussion M<sup>r</sup> R Wood agreed to write the late Steward for this amount. It was also reported that a Linen Basket, and a White Coat was missing from the Club premises.

A complaint was brought to the notice of the Committee regarding the very unseemly language used by M<sup>r</sup> E Marshall in the Club House on Saturday evening the 17<sup>th</sup> May 1952.

It was proposed by M<sup>r</sup> Bolt, seconded by M<sup>r</sup> Wood that the Secretary write M<sup>r</sup> Marshall to give a written apology to the Committee, and an undertaking to refrain from such behaviour in the future. (Carried).

Proposed by M<sup>r</sup> Cooper, Seconded by M<sup>r</sup> Bolt that the Ladies be allowed to use the Bar Lounge on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> June, on the day of the Mixed Foursomes. (Agreed).

The Social Committee made a request that they be allowed to run an Open Mixed Foursome Competition on Sunday the 14<sup>th</sup> September. (Granted).

A letter was received from M<sup>r</sup> T Fish asking ~~that~~ for permission to erect a rear opening and Gateway from his residence "Lynfield" onto the Golf Course was read. It was agreed to grant M<sup>r</sup> Fish this request.

A letter was read from the Secretary of the National Farmers Union complaining that Members of the Club were trespassing on land occupied by M<sup>r</sup> G Wrigley and damaging Fences. The Secretary was instructed to post a Notice on the Board, that the practice of retrieving Golf Balls played over the Fence on the right of the 8<sup>th</sup> Fairway must cease.

The Temple Publicity Services L<sup>td</sup> made a request that they supply Official Handbooks of the Course to the Club. It was agreed that this "Lie on the Table".

The Meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the Captain for presiding.
