

### **General Committee Meeting 2 February 1915**

Present: M<sup>r</sup> H G Hall presided.

Messrs R Brown, T F Kershaw, A Morris, & Slatter

Minutes of previous meeting read and confirmed.

In reference to the question of providing a shelter, after considering Ormerod's quotation £6 and comparing it with Marshall's it was decided that M<sup>r</sup> Dean's opinion be obtained about putting up a simple brick shelter as M<sup>r</sup> Hall kindly offered to provide bricks.

It was decided to allow the Hurst Red Cross Society the use of the Club house for a whist drive on Tuesday the 9<sup>th</sup> in<sup>st</sup>.

The secretary explained that in reply to a request from the Manchester Guardian, he forwarded the statement that 14 members had enlisted and that about 36 were within the limits of age eligible for enlistment.

It was decided to record the names of those members of the Club who had joined H M forces. Messrs Morris and Slatter to make enquiries and report at the meeting.

It was decided to raise Robinson's wage from the end of this month.

It was resolved that commencing at the March competition, spoons will be awarded as previously to the winners in the monthly competitions.

Owing to there being no entrants for the competitions during the last three months, qualifying rounds will be continued to include the June competition.
