

### General Committee Meeting Thursday Nov 12<sup>th</sup> 42.

Present: - A Hall in the Chair.

The minutes of last meeting held October 8<sup>th</sup> were read and adopted.

The letter to M<sup>r</sup> W H Andrew was produced and read and each member of the Committee present signed.

The Secretary reported that there was a vacancy on the committee caused by the election of M<sup>r</sup> A Hall to the Captaincy and having two years to run. It was decided not to fill the vacancy at present.

The Minutes of the Handicap House and Greens Committees were passed as read.

A letter was received from Messrs Thompson & Cooke, Solicitors stating that they were applying to have the case of Ashton Golf Club v Gledhill & Bowler remitted to the County Court and will proceed accordingly. A copy of the defence accompanied the above letter.

The attendance of the members in the evenings & the relationship to the closing hours and various economies was discussed and it was decided to carry on as at present until further notice.
