

General Committee Meeting Thursday May 14th 36.

Present: E Raines in the Chair.

Messrs H L Boardman, Ja^s Kershaw, J Taylor, H Ridyard, E S Jones, Syd. Hall, R Wood, J H Barratt, G Robson, W H Andrew and J Gibson.

The Minutes of last meeting held April 16th were read and adopted.

The following duly nominated and seconded were passed for membership by ballot: - F Holden, E Marshall, P MacCarthy and H Burlinson and Sydney H Lee of Halifax for Country Membership.

The Captain offered the congratulations of the Committee to M^r Robson on his election as a life member of the Club, and M^r Robson made suitable acknowledgement.

In reference to M^r Reg Holmes and Country membership, it was pointed out that he was not a member of another club and therefore not eligible for such membership.

It was agreed that Miss M Barratt having paid full Ladies subscription from the beginning of the season should be deemed a full Lady Member from that date and the word Junior be struck out of the list.
