

Special General Meeting of Members: Saturday March 9th 1929.

Present: M^r F Moss in the chair and sixty members present.

The meeting was called to deal with the following business. "Alteration of Rules 8c and 22a".

Rule 8c. The Annual Subscription for Gentlemen shall be £4-4-0 due in advance on the 25th March. Rule 22a. Ladies Annual Subscription shall be £2-2-0.

To consider and deal with a recommendation from the Committee that the Annual Subscription be raised from the 25th March as follows: -

Gentlemen to £5-5-0
Ladies to £3-3-0.

The Captain M^r F Moss opened the meeting and gave reasons for the suggested increase in subscriptions and stated that the proposal had been brought forward in Committee and had the unanimous backing of the Committee; he also stated that he would be glad if the members in discussing the proposal would confine themselves to the business before the meeting as nothing else could be considered. The Captain then formally moved the increase in the subscriptions and alteration of the Rules as per the Circular.

The Secretary M^r J Gibson then gave figures shewing Income and Expenditure from 1925 also the increase in same from 1917 and gave the number of members, also particulars of the improvements carried out in connection with the Club House and Course and how the increase had been brought about. He gave figures shewing that £80 for decoration of the Club internally, £60 for electric light and £55 to pay of loans to Honorary Members and members who had ceased to be members totalling up to £195 was required immediately; also that some of the £20 loans should be reduced to £10 and that £20 per annum should be left on one side to cover the cost of decoration of the Club which now had to be carried out by the Club.

Several other items were mentioned and the Secretary then formally seconded the proposal and asked for the support of the meeting in passing same.

M^r Robson, the Treasurer supported the resolution and gave particulars of income and expenditure and appealed for support. The Captain then declared the question open for discussion.

A goodly number of members took part in the discussion which followed and many questions were asked and answered. The proposal was then put to the meeting and 54 members voted for the proposal and 6 against. The proposal was declared carried.

A vote of thanks to the Captain for presiding terminated the meeting and the Captain replied and thanked the members for such a good attendance.
