General Committee Meeting Thursday June 13th 40.

The Minutes of last Meeting held May 9th were read and adopted.

The following duly nominated and seconded was passed for membership by ballot: - Miss Carpenter & Miss C hardman and Miss Josie Lees for Junior Membership.

The nomination of M^r & M^{rs} W Meeks for honorary membership was not accepted as being contrary to Rule 12.

The following accounts were passed for payment: - Williamson & Ball 5/4/8, Tom King 4/18/8, J Andrew & Co 10/7, W Monk 6/6, Income Tax 2nd Instalment 7/10/6, Electricity Account 8/15/10, and J W Hall Ltd 12/6. Total £27-19-3.

A letter was received from the Officers Mess offering to raise their subscription from $\pm 7/10/-$ to $\pm 10-0-0$ per annum and it was decided to accept the offer.
