The Minutes of last Meeting held April 8th also Minutes of Special Meetings held April 22nd and 29th were read and adopted.

The following duly nominated and seconded were passed for membership: - C M Bowden, W Walker, Richard Wood, and M^{rs} Richard Wood & M^{rs} Blanche Wilson, and M^{rs} Cyril Cawthron, Country Member.

M^r S Hall submitted a scheme for the ventilation of the Smoke Room at a cost of £38. Some discussion took place and it was generally agreed that something simpler should be tried, and it was decided that a sub-committee consisting of Mess^{rs} R Wood, S Hall, H Ridyard and J Gibson go into the question and report.

In response to the suggestions made by the Members at the Annual Meeting viz: - Tee Mats for Winter Use, Extension of Professional's Shop, Subscription to Brennan and Duties of Steward and Stewardess on Good Fridays the Committee decided as follows: -

Tee Mats not entertained. Extension to Shop decided upon and Urinal to be dispensed with. Subscription to Brennan not entertained. It was decided that the Club house shall be open on Good Fridays as ordinary days.

The Minutes of the House, Handicap and Greens Committees were passed as read.

The question of the purchase of a Ransomes Overgreen Mower for the Greens was discusses and it was moved by W H Andrew, seconded by Reg Bennett and carried that we purchase same at a cost of £115 subject to delivery in one month.
