

Rochdale Golf Club are proud to announce the installation of two new defibrillators at the golf club.

These vital pieces of life saving equipment will enhance members, staff and the wider community safety.

Installing the defibrillators - lifesaving devices, that can restore a regular heart rhythm during a cardiac arrest - to the outside of the clubhouse and the halfway hut will ensure that our life saving equipment is easily accessible to you, our staff, the emergency services and the local community.

The devices will give us all an added level of comfort, knowing that they are available in an emergency.

The equipment is registered on 'The Circuit' which is the 'National Defibrillator Network' - a British Heart Foundation initiative in partnership with the Association of Ambulance Chief Executives, Resuscitation Council and St John's Ambulance that provides a nationwide overview of where defibrillators are to provide vital information for NHS ambulance services and the local community in an emergency.

Our defibrillators can be used by anyone even if you have not been trained, they are fully automatic and will provide voice instructions to anyone providing aid, including how to attach its pads.

THE OFFICE, PRO SHOP, BAR, HALFWAY HUT CATERING STAFF AND GROUNDS STAFF WILL ALL BE PROVIDED WITH THE ACCESS CODES AND OF COURSE YOU WILL BE ABLE TO GAIN THIS CODE BY CONTACTING THE EMERGENCY SERVICES VIA THE 999 SYSTEM.










The RGC Greensstaff have been working with Special Branch to tame the trees around the course. We have a range of tree types and ages.

Wood cut and split by the team will be left to dry out and we will let members know when the wood is available for anyone with wood burners etc.


The 13th/14th/15th


The top of a large pine tree behind the 13th green has snapped off in the latest storm.
