

# DRESS CODE

Members are requested not only to adhere to the club's dress code themselves but to also ensure the dress code of their guests and other members on the course and in the clubhouse complies with the code.

Individuals must be smartly dressed both on and off the golf course. Failure to adhere to the dress code on the course may result in you being asked to leave the course unless the infringement is rectified and, in the clubhouse, you will not be served at the bar and may be asked to leave the premises.

<b>ACCEPTABLE DRESS CODE</b>	<b>UNACCEPTABLE</b>
Tailored trousers and shorts (or skirts/skorts for ladies)	No combat style trousers or shorts
Shirts with a collar and sleeves (ladies may wear sleeveless golf tops)	No denim or tracksuits
Shirts must be tucked in (ladies tops designed to be worn outside are allowed)	No vests, beachwear or football shirts
Socks of any length but predominantly one colour with shorts/skirts/skorts	
Golf shoes must be worn	
<b>IN &amp; AROUND THE CLUBHOUSE</b>	
All the above acceptable course dress	Golf shoes in the lounge bar
Tailored shirts may be worn outside of trousers if designed to do so	Combat style shorts or trousers
Smart denim (no tears or rips)	No hats or visors inside
Casual shoes and open toed sandals	Tracksuits, vest tops, beachwear or football shirts
Golf shoes in spike bar only	Sports trainers and plastic flip flops

## PLEASE NOTE

- The changing of golf shoes in the car park is forbidden – **During the Coronavirus pandemic this is ok.**
- Golfers must not share clubs or bags
- Mobile phones should be kept on silent on the course and in the clubhouse and should only be used on the course in an emergency.
