Bunker Rebuilds

Before Christmas, we managed to turf and tie up the 2 bunker rebuilds on 5 and 12. I was delighted to get these finished before breaking up for Christmas, so we didn't have to come back and finish them after New Year. Both bunkers will be marked as Ground Under Repair until March/April until the turf has started to root down. We will monitor this closely and try to get them back in play as quick as we can.

The rebuild of the long bunker on 17 started on the 9th of January. Chris Haspell (our Agronomic Consultant that was the Course Manager at Castle Stuart during construction) and Clyde Johnson (owner of Cunnin Golf Design that has worked at Tara Iti and St Patricks Links) came in on Tuesday 10th to do the excavation, shaping and setting of the revetted turf wall. They will be in again in the next few weeks to check on progress and to make sure everything is going to plan. Chris has shared his experience and taught the team how to revet bunkers and offered some tips and tricks.

Course Conditions

The start of the year has thrown up a mixed bag so far with below freezing temperatures, heavy rainstorms and some very pleasant sunny and mild days. We sprayed the greens before Christmas just to give them a boost of nutrition before the Festive Period and to help combat against disease pressure. The greens after Christmas are looking nice and clean with the disease scarring from November healed and no new signs of disease.

On the 9^{th} of January, we sprayed all the fairways with a wetting agent and fertiliser mix that will help to utilise any winter rain that we get and store moisture in the rootzone/soil going into the start of the season. This will help us greatly if we have a dry start to the year instead of trying to play catch up and applying irrigation to the fairway to combat any stress.

We also sprayed the approaches with a view to spray tees followed by greens again when the weather allows.

We managed to Solid Tines most of the tees with a handful left to do. We will also solid tine the approaches and any other areas that are looking worn when conditions allow. Along with some other remedial works on the worn area such as overseeding, topdressing, fertilising and watering, we will look to improve some of the these areas during the course of the year.

New Machinery

We will take delivery of a Vredo Overseeder and a Wiedenmann GXi8 in the coming weeks. Last week, a new trailed 3.6 metre brush and a set of unit chassis', both from Greentek were delivered. The brush will make a huge difference on fairways by standing the grass plant upright before a cut, helping to refine the fairway sward, leaving a much tighter and cleaner lie. Adding another set of chassis' will allow us greater flexibility on what attachments/tasks we can do on the greens, such a verti-cutting, scarifying or sarrel rolling.

We have also ordered a new JCB mini digger with EngCon Tilt-Rotator bucket which will be a great addition to the fleet for projects in the future. We will be demoing semi-rough mowers in the next few months before making a decision on which one will suit our terrain best. The committee have

shown great support to us by getting these items in and supplying us with the tools we need to really improve the conditions on the West Links.
