DRESS CODE

On the Course

The following attire is permitted:

- Weather-protective clothing specifically designed for golf
- Accredited golf shirts or roll necks (must be tucked in; ladies' tops may be worn out if designed for this)
- Accredited golf footwear and trousers (no blue denim or combat trousers)
- Knee-length tailored shorts (not cargo shorts) with either knee-length socks or any white socks

In the Clubhouse

Smart casual dress is required at all times. The following are permitted:

- Accredited golf attire
- Tailored shorts with leisure shoes, deck shoes, or sandals (socks optional)
- Smart jeans without rips or repairs
- Clean soft spike golf shoes (Spike Bar only)
- Clean dimpled golf shoes (permitted throughout the clubhouse during summer only)

Please Note

The following are not permitted in the clubhouse:

- Rainwear, hats, caps, or visors
- Jogging bottoms, combat trousers, cargo shorts/trousers, or tracksuits
- Tee shirts or vests
- Wet or muddy clothing or footwear

Anyone improperly attired may not be served in the Spike Bar, Lounge, or Restaurant.



CARE OF THE COURSE

- We expect all members, guests, and visitors to take pride in preserving the quality of our course.

Trollies & Buggies

- Trollies and buggies must be kept to designated paths at all times where provided.
- At all other times, they must be kept outside the perimeter of greenside bunkers and off teeing areas.
- Please respect all signage, particularly in 'no go' areas, such as around the 14th green and 15th tee. These restrictions help prevent unnecessary wear and protect the course.

Bunkers

- Before leaving a bunker, please carefully rake and smooth all footprints, including those of other players nearby.

Divots & Pitch Marks

- Please repair any divots and all pitch marks on the green, whether or not they are your own.

Avoiding Damage

- Do not strike the ground with clubs during practice swings or in frustration.
- Take care when placing the flagstick on the green.
- Never use a club head to retrieve a ball from the hole to avoid damaging the cup.
