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## Summary of Key Points from the BCLGA Executive Meeting November 2018

**AGM** - The Executive reflected on the recent AGM and ways to improve the meeting for 2019.

**Forward Planning** - An additional Executive Meeting was agreed for early January to concentrate solely on governance and planning for the future.

**Finance** - current position noted; budget allocation agreed for the Gala Day in July and for the allocation of grants in 2019;

**Competition Issues** - All BCLGA competition rules and conditions to be revised to reflect the 2019 Rules of Golf and new terminology; BCLGA competitions for the higher handicappers to be capped at 36.0 on closing date for competition, although player will play of actual handicap if risen above 36 during the competition; discussion about Seniors versus Vets competition to be revisited at January Executive and taken to February Delegates meeting.

**Communication Issues** - Progress with new website discussed, with aim to launch before Christmas; Tri-fold in development, publication date dependent on speed of finalising outstanding fixtures; some progress with Opt-in numbers but further work needed through delegates.

**Governance** - Insurance and succession planning discussed.

### **Other Issues**

- 23rd September 2019 - BCLGA will be hosting a major inter-county Seniors event at Woburn
- Various 2019 rules seminars have been held by the County Handicap Adviser at request of individual clubs
- Most 2019 Junior fixtures now organised; there is a new publicity officer for the junior section
- Brenda King Foursomes - management of this event to move from England Golf to Regions on rotational basis
- National Finals Week will continue in 5 day format for 2019 and 2020, but will move to 3 day format from 2021

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
