Summary of Key Points from the BCLGA Executive Meeting December 2019

Competitions:

County Championships and Par 3 being planned

Governance:

- Final draft Business Plan discussed for issue in January 2020
- Tri-fold being revised for 2020 and will be issued in early January 2020
- Succession planning: revised job descriptions in preparation for the vacancies that will fall vacant in November 2020

Finance:

- The County's financial position was reviewed. Costs are increasing due to the success of the County team at County Match Week and National Finals, the grant scheme and the Gala Day. Whilst the grants and Gala Day are discretionary expenditure, the costs of sending the team to CMW and NFW need to be included in future core expenditure. As a result the following decisions have been reached and will be explained to delegates in February 2020:
 - o the affiliation fee will increase from November 2020
 - o the tradition of a County Captain's charity will be reviewed
 - Entrance fees for competitions have not been increased for some time. It was agreed that a new schedule of entry fees would be actioned for 2020
 - County Cards: From 2020, all ladies whose clubs participate in the County card scheme (which is all Bucks clubs except The Buckinghamshire and Woburn) will be eligible for a County Card free of charge (except for a small postage/admin cost). This will be a good membership benefit (worth circa £15 per annum)
 - various 2019 expense lines to be looked at in more detail to see whether any other costs can be trimmed
