COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP 2019

TERMS OF THE COMPETITION

1. The Championship shall be played in according to the general BCLGA "Local Rules, Terms of the Competition and General Regulations".
2. Players must be FULL Members of the Buckinghamshire County Ladies Golf Association.
3. The Championship shall consist of two 18-hole stroke play qualifying rounds played on the first day, for which one draw will be made.

The players returning the 16 lowest aggregate gross scores shall qualify for match play. The draw shall be made according to the automatic draw and shall be posted as soon as possible after termination of play. The next four players will be held as reserves – any withdrawal will be accepted up to 10pm on the day preceding the match play event. After that time any withdrawal will constitute a walkover.

4. All Ties shall be decided on the last 18, 9, 6, 3 or last hole. If a further tie results the qualifying place shall be decided by sudden-death playoff, stroke play, over holes as decided by the Championship Committee.
5. The Intermediate Champion shall be the player aged between 18 & 25 on 1 January 2019 with the best 36-hole gross score.
6. The Seniors' Champion shall be the player aged 50 years and over on 12 May 2019 with the best gross score for 18 holes. For those seniors playing 36 holes the morning round will qualify for the Seniors' Championship.
7. Each match shall consist of one round of 18 holes and be played to a conclusion (a match all square on leaving the 18th green will continue from the first tee to a conclusion).
8. In the event of adverse conditions, the Championship Committee reserves the right to alter the format of the competition to achieve a result (see point 8 in the "Conditions of Competition").
9. The County President, County Captain and Competition Secretary are members of the Championship Committee. In all matters the decision of the Championship Committee is final.
10. Juniors are welcome to enter the championship; however parents/guardians are reminded that it is their responsibility to arrange for safeguarding of their child.

For each round, a 'responsible adult' must be nominated (be it a parent or any other nominated adult) who will be responsible for the junior for the duration of the round. The 'responsible adult' must have details of emergency contact information and any special medical needs of the junior. The junior and her playing companion or opponent must be provided with the contact telephone number of the nominated 'responsible adult'.

Note: 'duration of the round' includes the time from a junior being dropped off by parents/guardians to their collection by parents/guardians.
