4. **CAPTAIN'S REPORT – Sue Ashworth** *read in absence*

We now progress to the **English Women's National Finals** held at Royal North Devon 17th - 21st September. Our progress will be posted daily via the county website & although I'm aware it's a very long way to travel, if you're in the area or just fancy a couple of days by the seaside, please come along to support us & of course wear RED!

I've spent more time on courses as a 'spectator' than as a 'player' of late, but I thoroughly enjoyed my day at Whiteleaf for the **County Summer meeting** at the end of June. A gorgeous day, superbly organised by Sally with the usual Whiteleaf welcome & delicious food. Thank you Sally & your team of helpers for a great day & for the £310 raised from the 'pen sweep' for my charity (The Willow Foundation).

The launch of our new **County Grant** scheme at the beginning of the year has proved popular & we've had plenty of interest. Applications were invited by 1st April & 1st August with a total of £5K being set aside to help **any** BCLGA member should she wish to apply. Gail Sharp chairs the Committee receiving & reviewing these applications & I shall leave Gail to speak more about what's been happening this year.

Progress is continuing with the development of our **new County website** & we hope to 'go live' in the Autumn. We shall be asking for a panel of 'guinea pigs' (from you, the Delegates) to 'test-drive' the new site to make sure it's as easy to use as we think it is! It would be useful if some of the volunteers have had experience of using the current website whilst others may not be so familiar with navigating it in its current form. Obviously, we know what needs to be available & included on the new website, but we want to make sure you (the end-user) can actually find it!

Congratulations to both our **Junior Handicap & Scratch Teams & also our County 2nd Team for reaching their respective Midland South Team Finals** this year. Our 2nd Team played Hereford & Worcestershire in the final on 22nd August at the Oxford GC & our Junior handicap & scratch teams played Northants in their final on 28th August at Tadmarton Heath. I shall leave Janet & Janette to reveal the results, but well done to all the players who contributed to making it to the Finals once again this year!

Having been **Bucks Shield** winners for the past 5 years, Stoke Park are going to allow a different selection of contenders to compete on Finals Day this year which will be held on 14th September at Flackwell Heath. Burnham Beeches, Ellesborough, Harleyford & Woburn will do battle to win this most prestigious event & I can confidently say we will have a new champion club this year - best of luck to you all.

We have 3 representatives playing in the **EG Champion of Champions** this weekend (7th-9th Sept). Daisy Kennedy (Stoke Park) our County Champion, Denise Goodacre (Lambourne) our Senior County Champion & Olivia Lee (Gerrards Cross) our County Junior Champion. They will play against all the other County champions at Frilford Heath GC & I know they would appreciate 'Good Luck' messages from their home clubs if you'd like to prompt your respective Lady Captains please.

You'll be aware that we are slowly moving towards the introduction of the **World Handicapping System** & EG have been touring the country offering golf clubs & County Associations & Unions the opportunity to learn more about the proposed changes. If your club Handicap Secretary &/or management have not yet attended a workshop, please encourage them to do so as the next batch of venues & dates are now available through the EG website. A maximum of 3 representatives from each club are permitted & they can sign-up online.

(iii) **2nd TEAM CAPTAIN** - Janette Psyllides

The 2<sup>nd</sup> team have now completed their fixtures for 2018 and I am delighted to report that we have had an excellent year.

In April we played Oxfordshire at Huntercombe GC and won the match 7-2. In May we played Berkshire at Harleyford and also prevailed by a margin of 7-2. This put us at the top of our mini league and qualified us for the Midlands South Regional Final against the Northern winners, who were Hereford & Worcestershire.

The final took place on 22<sup>nd</sup> August at Oxford GC. Maggie Findley, the Oxfordshire 2<sup>nd</sup> Team Captain very kindly acted as starter in the morning. We had a strong team and took a commanding lead in the morning foursomes, coming from behind in the last group to win all 3 matches.

After a well earned lunch break and a couple of team changes the singles matches commenced. We knew that we needed to focus as H & W would come out fighting and the matches all proved very tight. Karen Pollard, the Oxfordshire County Captain acted as starter. The sun finally shone and despite some tense moments, we took the first 2 matches on the

16<sup>th</sup> hole to ensure victory. The overall result finished with a 6-3 win for Bucks to retain the league title.

Thanks to Oxfordshire for hosting a great day at an interesting and challenging course, and to Herefordshire and Worcestershire who proved to be steely competitors and great sports. Thanks also to Gail Sharp, Vice County Captain; Sue Ashworth, County Captain; Sally Harborne, President; DI Davies, Joint Competitions Organiser and Tony Bowers, County Coach, for coming along to support the team – it was very much appreciated.

The players have been brilliant all season we have had a great blend of youth and experience and a great team spirit. **CTO** - Tony Bowers *read in absence*

County Match Week - Once again Bucks were successful at CMW for the 6th time in the last 7 years

A fantastic result for the team who all performed fantastically well in the new 2 and a half day format and we are now taking a very strong and very young squad down to the Nationals in September at Royal North Devon.

Any support would be greatly appreciated by all the Team.

I attended the final round robin scratch match v Berks at Mill Ride on August 4th and the team had a great result winning 3-0 with some fantastic golf being played by our very talented youngsters. As a result they qualified for the Mid-South team finals held at Tadmarton Heath.

On 26th August I attended the Mid -South Scratch/Handicap Championships at Temple GC.

The event was marred by awful weather, constant heavy rain and as a consequence the afternoon rounds were cancelled. There was some great golf in the morning and Amelia Curtis finished a very creditable 2nd in the scratch event.

On 28th August I attended the Mid South Team Finals at Tadmarton Heath and although the Bucks teams performed extremely well, they finished 2nd in both events not helped by slightly under strength squads due to event clashes and holidays, also the fact that so many of our Juniors' handicaps have plummeted throughout the season. Clearly victims of our own success!

We held 2 training sessions for the Intermediate squads through the summer, both at the RMS school in Rickmansworth. These sessions were well attended and the girls performed very well in the skills challenges that I set them. It's great to see the fantastic improvements in their skills sets. These sessions bring together a wide variety of girls who can meet new players to arrange games etc at each other's clubs.

Finally, I attended the Junior County Championships at Burnham Beeches last Thursday and the weather was fantastic for the event. The golf on display was just as good.

The overall winner was Olivia Lee with a gross 78 for the 2nd year running but there were lots of other fantastic scores and performances too.

**ENGLAND GOLF REPRESENTATIVE** - Phillipa Cook *read in absence*

There is little to report at this meeting as the next Voting Members' meeting is next week at Woodhall Spa.

An additional Voting Members' meeting was held at Copt Heath on 3rd July to try and resolve the issue of the rise in affiliation fees. The Board had proposed that the affiliation fee be set at £9.50 for 2019. The level for future years would be considered through the long-term Business Plan, which would be discussed and debated over the coming months. This proposal did not get the required approval at the April meeting and so the additional meeting was called.

Some additional financial information was given out on the day of the July meeting. This meant that some counties were considering changing their vote to accept the affiliation fee increase but they only had a mandate from their county to vote against the proposal. The vote on the proposal to increase the affiliation fee was therefore adjourned until the September Voting Members' meeting, next week. This delayed decision about the 2019 fees will give just enough time for the fee to be notified to the counties in advance of them sending out their 2019 invoices to the clubs.

All the Midland South competitions have now been held with a good attendance at all of them. Next year Berkshire will host a new competition, the Seniors' Championships which will be an 18-hole stroke play event. At the conclusion of County Week at Denham the Midland South Voting Members met with James Crampton to have a general discussion about the Regional competitions.

**USGA RATING:**

Eight courses have been rated so far this year:-

Beaconsfield, Burnham Beeches, Denham, Ellesborough, Stoke Park (Lane Jackson), Woburn Dukes, Duchess & Marquess.

A further two courses will be rated in the next few weeks (Buckingham & Harleyford). This will make the total for the year 10 and the total number of Bucks courses rated 31. The remaining courses will be done next year.

**COUNTY MATCH WEEK, 18th to 20th JUNE:**

As you will know this year's County Week was held over three days rather than the full week. As the first county to host the event in this shortened form there was a huge amount of work involved but it was satisfying to show that this format is quite feasible. The event ran very smoothly and thanks should be recorded to all those volunteers who gave up their time to help. Particular thanks to Helen Mines for all her hard work on the admin side and to Janet Beal for making sure that all was in order on the rules and refereeing side of things.

Denham are to be congratulated on hosting this successful event. The course was in excellent condition, the club house facilities worked very well and the food was as ever, exceptional. The management, staff and members were extremely friendly and helpful.

At the County Week Debrief Meeting on 31st July the six counties were asked to vote on whether they would like 2019 to be a 3 or 5-day event. The vote went in favour of the shortened format. It was agreed that the 3-day format should be adopted for CMW 2019 and after that event the counties would vote again at the 2019 Debrief Meeting to decide which format would be taken forward for the foreseeable future.

Other Regions were anxiously waiting to see how our County Week went, waiting to decide

- whether to change the format for their own Region's County Week. I have already sent an information pack to two Regions giving details of how the our County Week was organised. I will be sending a full report to James Crampton for distribution to those on the EG Championship Working Group as the County Week format will be an item on the agenda for their meeting in October.
8. **EXECUTIVE VACANCIES**  
 Because we were faced with recruiting two new Competition Secretaries at once, we decided to work with one Competition Secretary (who would be an Executive member) and recruit a team of volunteers reporting to the Competition Secretary, who would each look after a different aspect of the competition calendar. Gilly Stimpson has agreed to remain as Competition Secretary for one more year. Jackie Maher, (Burnham Beeches), has agreed to coordinate the knockouts. We have another likely volunteer for the Bucks Shield and Interclub Foursomes, so we just need to find one volunteer for the running of the Leagues.
- There are no other vacancies on the Executive Committee. However, the position of Junior match organiser is still vacant.
