<u>Interclub Match Results</u> The Barton Shield Luttrelstown Drama

If it was drama and a nail-biting finish you were after last Sunday, West Dublin delivered. While many eyes were on Croke Park, just 14 kilometres away our Barton Shield team faced a strong Luttrelstown side in a gripping contest.

Fresh off a historic Senior Cup win, our first in 26 years, this was always going to be a stern test. Led by Captain Evan Farrell and Harley Phipps, with Gavin Tiernan and Louis Goodman following, both pairs had slow starts. After six holes, we were 5 down combined, an uphill battle.

But if this team has shown anything, it's resilience. From 2 down, Evan and Harley caught fire, making six birdies in nine holes, including a clutch chip-in by Harley on 14, to go 5 up. Meanwhile, Gavin and Louis clawed their way back into their match, though Luttrelstown responded to each surge.

Match 1 lost the 18th to finish 4up, but Match 2 was 4 down on 16. Losing that hole we trailed by one overall. These pressure moments are what this team has embraced all year.

Gavin's booming drive on 17 cut the corner and enabled Louis to hit it tight to close the deficit. With the match now tied overall, Louis stepped up on 18, splitting the fairway with the shot of the day. Luttrelstown, under pressure for the first time, couldn't answer. Gavin followed with a towering iron shot over water on the par 5 to 40 feet, and Louis coolly nestled his putt within gimme range to seal a dramatic overall 1 up victory for County Louth.

Winning is a habit, but winning the final two holes under pressure, takes mental grit. With three teenagers on the team, we now look ahead to our **second regional final** in three weeks.

I urge everyone available to get behind this team in the coming weeks. They are doing our club immensely proud.
