

## Charlton Cup Ladies Singles Knockout

---

### Description

The Charlton Cup is a women's match-play competition. It will be open for entries from **1 March to 1 April** each year. A draw will take place and all entrants will be notified of their opponents by email.

---

### General Terms of Competition

- The Committee in charge of all aspects of running the Club's Ladies Competitions, as defined in the Rules of Golf, shall be the **Ladies' Competition Committee**.
  - The handicapping of members shall be in accordance with the **World Handicap System**, as administered by England Golf and the Council of National Golf Unions (CONGU).

### Eligibility

This competition is open to all lady members provided that:

- They have a maximum individual **Course Handicap of 36**. (Members with higher handicaps may enter, but the number of shots received will be based on this limit of 36.)
  - They have played a total of **54 holes in qualifying competitions** in the previous 12-month period (including at least one 18-hole competition).
  - Members under 18 have been approved by the Club Professional as ready for competition golf at the time of the initial draw.

### Note

The Club recognises that medical conditions may occasionally prevent a member from completing 54 holes of competition golf in the required period. Any member returning to golf in such circumstances should contact the Competitions Committee for consideration.

### Entries

By entering any knockout competition, players must:

- Agree to abide by the rules set out in this document.
  - Be available to play in the final on **Hale Golf Club Finals Day**.
- 

### Arranging the Match

- It is the equal responsibility of both players to arrange their match by the specified completion date.
- Players are expected to begin communication within **7 days of the initial draw**, and in subsequent rounds, no later than the day after the previous round's completion date.
- Each player must offer **three reasonable dates** via email, at least **two of which must be at weekends**. Failure to do so may result in the opponent being entitled to claim the match. (Email evidence may be required in the event of a dispute.)
- If a mutually agreeable date cannot be found, or conditions prevent play, competitors must agree who will progress to the next round.

- Once agreed, tee times should be reserved using the How did I do booking system up to 2 weeks in advance).
  - Please ensure both front and back 9 holes are booked.
  - To prevent other members joining, **do not select** “Allow members to join any partial times”.

---

### **Extensions**

- As a general rule, **extensions** will not be granted, as this is unfair to other competitors. The committee reserve the right, however, to allow modest extensions in exceptional cases only – holidays will not be regarded as exceptional.
- The Committee’s decision on any dispute is final.

---

### **Playing the Match**

- Matches will be played from the **red tees**.
- The scheduled starting time is the agreed tee time.
  - If a player is not ready to play at that time, their opponent may claim the match.
- A player arriving within **5 minutes** may incur the general penalty under **Rule 5.3a**.
- The team at the top of the draw will **tee off first**.
  -
- Play shall be in accordance with the **Rules of Golf** and any applicable local rules.
- If the match is tied after the final hole, play will continue **hole by hole until a winner is decided** (Rule 3.2a(4)).
- If play cannot continue on the day, the match may be resumed from where it stopped, but must be completed by the round’s closing date.

---

### **Strokes Received**

- Singles matches: **Full difference of Course Handicap**.

---

### **Recording the Match Result**

- The winner must record the result within **24 hours** using Club V1.
- Failure to do so may result in the **match result being reversed**.
