Gordon Murray Salvers

Mixed Foursomes Knockout



Description

The Gordon Murray Salvers is a mixed foursomes match-play competition. It will be open for entries from the 1st to the 14th March each year. A draw will take place the following day and all entrants will be notified of their opponents by email.

General Terms of Competition:

- The Committee in charge of all aspects of running the Club's Mixed Competitions as defined in the Rules of Golf shall be a sub committee comprised of representatives from both the Men's and Women's Competition Committees.
- The handicapping of Members shall be in accordance with the World Handicap System as administered by England Golf and the Council of National Golf Unions (CONGU).
- Any breach of the following rules may result in an appropriate penalty being imposed by the Competition Committee.

Eligibility:

This competition is open to all members provided:

- They hold a WHS Handicap Index at the time of the draw for the first round.
- Members under 18 are allowed to enter if they have been approved by the club professional as ready for competition golf at the time of the initial draw.

Entries:

By entering any of the knockout competitions, players must:

- Agree to abide by the rules set out in this document.
- Must be available to play in the final on Hale Golf Club Finals Day. (Typically, the Sunday after Mens Medal Final) Unless the course is closed by the Greens Committee

Arranging the Match:

- It is the equal responsibility of both teams to arrange for their match to be played by the completion date specified for that round.
- Parties are expected to start communicating with each other within seven days of the initial draw being announced and, in subsequent rounds, no later than the day after the scheduled completion date for the previous round.
- Using email each team must offer three reasonable dates to their opponents, at least two of which must be a weekend; otherwise, their opponents can legitimately claim the match. (In the event of any dispute this email trail will be required by the Committee).
- If a mutually agreeable date cannot be found, or conditions prevent the match from being played, the competitors must agree between them who is to go through to the next round.

Once agreed, reserve the tee times using the Club V1 Booking system up to 2 weeks prior to your intended match (remember that you will need to book a slot for the back 9 too)! In order to prevent other members joining you in a singles match by booking into the vacant Player 3/4 slots, DO NOT check the box "Allow members to join any partial times".

Extensions:

- As a general rule there will be no extensions, as this is unfair to the other competitors. The Committee reserve the right, however, to allow modest extensions in exceptional cases only holidays will not be regarded as exceptional.
- The committee will rule on any dispute.

Playing the Match:

- The men will tee off 1st off the Blue tees; the women will tee-off on the even holes from the Red tees.
- The match will be played using the men's Blue tee pars and stroke indexes.
- The scheduled starting time is deemed to be the agreed and booked tee-time. If any team is not present on the tee and ready to play at that time, their opponents are entitled to claim the match unless their opponents are both ready to play within 5 minutes of the scheduled time in which case the general penalty will apply. Rule 5.3a
- Play shall be in accordance with the rules of golf and any local rule currently in force.
- If a match is tied after the final hole, the match is extended one hole at a time until there is a winner. Rule 3.2a(4)
- If conditions prevent the match being extended that day, the match may be resumed on another day from the place where play ceased, but the match must be concluded by the closing date for the round in question.

Strokes received:

- The matches will be played using half the difference of the combined course handicap but with a maximum individual COURSE HANDICAP of 30 for the men and 40 for the women.
 - Men use the Blue Course to determine their course handicaps
 - Ladies use the Red Course to determine their course handicaps
- Members with higher handicaps may enter but the number of shots received will be based on these limits.

Recording the Match Result:

- The winners must record the result within 24 hours of the match ending using Club V1.
- Failure to record the result correctly or within the 24 hours stipulated above may result in the match result being reversed.
