Hale Golf and Country Club Continues to Progress

Sleepy old Hale Golf Club was rebranded Hale Golf and Country Club – "Altrincham's Premier Golf Resort" – in 2006.

Now, yet again we are the forefront of Golf change as we go Corporate, a new major Limited Company!

The New Par 3 4th Hole

We are delighted to see that the club's recent major civil engineering project is coming to an end, and members could be playing the new par 3 4th Hole from next Spring. It heralds more change.

The first issue is what we are going to call the new hole. All holes at Hale have a name. The current 7th is called Farm, so we need a new name for the new 4th when the Farm has gone. The Greens Committee is hosting a members' competition to name the hole, with the prize of a handy Telescopic Ball Retriever for the winning suggestion. This will be useful in retrieving your ball from the new pond. There's quite a variety of names submitted so far with "HS2" an early favourite. One anonymous suggestion being considered by the Greens Committee is "Green Bank" when modesty dissuaded the gentleman member from identifying himself.

The new hole increases the length of the 9-hole course by approximately 300 yards, of which 230 yards are additional walking. It will solve the problem of the current bottleneck between 3 and 4, whilst not speeding up play – which would have been an unpopular break from the traditions of Hale.



Sadly, another tradition will disappear - the 3rd/12th Hole Swagger. The Swagger is the jaunty walk members can smugly adopt when they have hit their second shot on the 3rd or 12th onto the putting green. It was pioneered by David Smith and perfected by Martin Bramwell. You first park your cart egregiously by the current 4th tee to signal a successful second shot to the players behind; the Swagger starts in earnest when the player rests his or her putter on

Some more skilful players may of course choose to take a putter <u>and</u> an 8 iron for the next tee shot in a new version of the Swagger. An additional challenge with the new hole will come when players are playing the 3rd or 12th and thin their pitch or bunker shot into the new pond. The average rule-savvy Hale member will already be aware of the relief and penalty options for going into a water hazard behind a green, so there's no need for a patronising explanation here.

The talk of the clubhouse is just exactly what is the purpose of the new bell 300 yards down the 5th fairway?

News from Greens


With our new incorporated status, we have social and environmental responsibilities, and the club/company seeks to be a leader in that field.

News From Greens

Greens have been forced to postpone their final winter project, the replacement of the 2 treacherous bunkers on the 3rd. Replacement was thought necessary following complaints from members who had failed to get out of them, an obvious design fault in the bunkers .

Do not be fooled by the size of the Hale Bunkers. You need an aerial picture to see why they are a candidate. Cunningly placed at the end of a 270 yard par 4, an approach shot with up to 130 yards carry is required to safely clear the bunkers and land on the postage-stamp sized 30 yard 3rd green.

Greens had decided these hazards are way above the abilities of the average Hale golfer, but that decision is now under review.

Greens are also pleased to report on praise from England Golf. Members will recall that the course was assessed last year when the new 4th hole opened; as a consequence our course rating was increased. As it was a new hole England Golf recently re-visited it to confirm their original rating and they commented favourably on the condition of the Green one year on. They went as far as saying that it has weathered its first year well, and is as pristine as the day it opened. Such is its quality they further added that that there wasn't any evidence of damage from pitch marks since it was brought into action, unlike other Hale greens they examined.


