

 The Club is in no way responsible for the engagement or payment of Caddies.

2. On WEEK-DAYS:

- (c) Caddles over 16 years of age will be engaged and paid direct by Members and Visitors, the charge being 1/6 per round and a fee of 2d to the Caddle Master.
- (5) Caddies under 16 years of age will be engaged through the Caddie Master at the following rates:---

1st Class - 1/6 per roun 2nd do. - 1/3 do.

On SUNDAYS:

The charge for Caddies will be 2/4 for all grades, together with a fee of 2d, to the Caddie Master.

 The Caddie Master's fee is a return for his services in maintaining order and discipline amongst the Caddies and assisting players in engaging and paying them.





1927 Course Layout




1920 THE COUNTY CHAMPIONS










British Walker Cup Team Brookline 1932 J.A. Stout is seated on the right in the middle row.




