Four-Ball Scores

Four-Ball formats are not an 'authorized format of play' in this country, which means these scores do not normally count towards your Handicap Index. HOWEVER, in certain circumstances a player's individual score from a competition will be used.





For a score to **count** the following **3 conditions** must be met:



The player's **individual score** must count towards the **team's score** on at least **9 holes**








The team's **net score** must be at **least 6** strokes better than **par** (or at least **42 points** in **Stableford**)

The player's **individual score** must be **equal** to or **better** than **36 Stableford points** as calculated below:

Calculation of Player's Individual Stableford Score



This will produce an **individual 18-hole Stableford score**, which is **rounded down** to the **nearest whole number**. The score is then **adjusted** for any **difference** in the **Course Handicap** and the **Playing Handicap** for the event:



Course Handicap: 17



Playing Handicap: 14
